

Monday - March 6th 1950

An adjourned meeting of the Council was held on Monday, March 6th 1950 at 7:33 P.M. in the Municipal Hall.

Present: Reeve Beamish in the Chair, Crs. Wilks, MacSorley, Drummond, Philps, Armstrong, Stephens and Isherwood.

Special Committee appointed to consider applications for the position of Building Inspector, submitted recommendation that Mr. E.L. King be appointed to the position.

Moved by Cr. Stephens, Seconded by Cr. MacSorley: "That the recommendation of the Committee be adopted."

Carried Unanimously

Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Isherwood: "That authority be granted to execute Agreement between the Corporation of Burnaby and L. and W.J. Greenall respecting subdivision of lands in D.L. 175, that the document be signed by the Reeve and Clerk and the Corporate Seal be affixed thereto."

Carried Unanimously

Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Isherwood: "That Burnaby Land Sale By-law No. 3, 1950 be now reconsidered."

Carried Unanimously

Moved by Cr. MacSorley, Seconded by Cr. Isherwood: "That Burnaby Land Sale By-law No. 3, 1950 be now finally adopted, that it be signed by the Reeve and Clerk, and the Corporate Seal be affixed thereto."

Carried ~~Un~~ Cr. Philps voting against.

1. Delegation appeared in connection with reduction in service by the B.C. Electric Rly. Co. on the Burnaby Lake Interurban Line, and requested an audience. Moved by Cr. Stephens, Seconded by Cr. Drummond: "That the Delegation be heard." Carried Unanimously
2. Spokesman for the Broadview District spoke on behalf of residents south of the Louheed Highway, and north of the Grandview Highway, advising the residents in this area were required to walk one-half mile to the nearest transportation, with a service of one hour and twenty minutes. Spokesman further pointed out that there was no north-south service for this area, and that a one mile walk was necessary to the Boundary Road service.
3. Mr. Salisbury attended as representative of the Central Burnaby Ratepayers & Citizens Association registering the Associations opposition to the reduction in service on the Burnaby Lake line. Mr. Salisbury presented a petition through Cr. Armstrong, containing approximately 1120 names of persons affected by the service reduction, advising that the said petition was not being presented through the Association, but that the membership considered the move to be a retrograde step in the development of the community. Moved by Cr. Philps, Seconded by Cr. Isherwood: "That the information and petition presented be received and referred to the standing Transportation Committee for future study and discussion with B.C.E.R. Company officials." Carried Unanimously

The meeting then adjourned.
