F. C. Slee et al submitted petition for hard surfacing Second Street between 16th Avenue and 20th Avenue, this section of road being the main entrance to Burnaby Park.

L. W. Hanson wrote with reference to his claim for loss of shoes and rubbers as a result of the said goods having been allegedly removed by members of the Garbage Department, advising that he had evidence in his possession which would indicate that the goods were definitely removed by our employees and requesting that further consideration be given to his claim.

P. L. Richardson wrote with reference to settlement made of his Sheep Protection Act Claim for loss of two sheep expressing dissatisfaction at the amount of the settlement and requesting that further consideration be given to the claim.
