B. C. Telephone Company wrote giving results of the recent vote taken on the property Vancouver Extended Area Service by the Company, pointing out that while the results indicate a substantial majority of the subscribers who returned ballots, voted in favour of the Extended Area Service plan and that the introduction of such service was still contingent upon approval of the Board of Transport Commissioners for Canada. It was further pointed out that the service could not be implemented until the New Westminster area was converted to automatic operation.
