Secretary, Burnaby Lake Men's Service Club, wrote with reference to the land adjoining the park site occupied by the Vailey View Community Centre, suggesting that this land be set aside for park purposes as an enlargement of the present park area.

Moved by Councillor Philrs and seconded by Councillor Isherwood "That the letter be received and filed for future consideration."

Carried Unanimously.

Mr. and Mrs. C. Kretz wrote with reference to their claim for re-landscaping their boulevard on Maywood Street and Willington Avenue, sivising that the offer made by the Council committee was not acceptable and requesting that the Corporation pay the sum of \$100.00 towards this work and they would be prepared to pay the balance of \$60.00. Councillor MacSorley advised on behalf of the committee that an offer had

Councillor MacSorley advised on behalf of the committee that an offer had been made to the claimants to supply sufficient top soil to dress the subject boulevard, but that no offer had been made to restore the boulevard to its original landscaped condition after the installation of a water main. The Branch felt that this would be more beneficial from both spectators and players standpoint and would remove the pitch where it would not be effected by large trucks unloading pipe and causing deep ruts in the pitch such as the present pitch was receiving as a result of the storing of pipes at the north end. Drummond) and the Engineer for report."

Greater Vancouver Metropolitan Industrial Jevelopment Commission wrote suggesting that the Council give consideration to a proposal to sponsor a fire boat on Burrard Inlet on a joint basis with other cities and municipalities which border the Inlet, the said boat to be built and operated to serve the entire harbour area and be an addition to the fire boat now operated by the city of Vancouver.

Engineer submitted a report in connection with the extension of bus routes in the Strile Avenue - Edmonis area, advising that in order to provide for an extension of bus service to Stride Avenue, it would be necessary to carry out works at an estimated cost of \$900.00 involving the widening of culverts, clearing of intersections and removing obstructions. In addition, the Engineer reported it would be necessary to fill a large ravine on 19th Street near 18th Avenue and that in order to facilitate this a culvert should be installed at an approximate cost of \$3,000.00 making a total of \$3,900.00 to be charged against the current year's estimates. The Engineer recommended that these expenditures be authorized in order that the work may be fulfilled this fall.
Moved by Councillor Isherwood and seconded by Councillor MacSorley "That the recommendation of the Engineer be adopted subject to finis being available in the current year's estimates.

Carried Unanimously.

Engineer submitted report on the extension of Scenic Orive and Penzance Orive from Willington Avenue east to Glasgow Avenue (the easterly boundary of the new Standard 011. site). In a letter from Standard Oil, the Company proposed the opening and paving of this arrest which would commence at Willingdon Avenue and Oxford Street and extend across Confederation Park via the undeficated portion of Scenic)rive to Gamma Avenue and thence follows Penzance)rive easterly to Glasgow Avenue. The total length of street would be 5800 ft. and the estimated cost of the work would be \$33,500. This figure may be broken down as follows:

Clearing, grading and gravelling \$23,800.
Peving, 20 ft. asphalt cap 9,700.

Standard Oil has an obvious interest in this street as it will provide a short economical link between their two sites, and for this reason they have agreed to contribute the sum of \$18,600. towards the cost of the project. Furthermore, Imperial Oil, who own property immediately east of Glasgow Avenue have indicated that they would contribute the sum of \$8,700. in order that they may obtain access to their land. However, they do not wish to make this money available until they are prepared to develop their site. In an arrangement between the two Oil Companies, Standard Oil has agreed to access the property of the \$8,700 and all the access to their land. Stundard 011 has agreed to accept responsibility for payment of the \$8,700. as well as their own share on the condition that the Corporation accept the undertaking of Imperial Oil to contribute their share at a later date. The balance of the cost of the job \$6,200. would represent the Corroration's share, and for this expenditure, we would obtain a paved street which would benefit not only the Oil Companies but also the entire Capitol Hill area, providing a through street

across the north and of the park to Boundary Poud.

The section through Confederation Park, which was rough graied some years ago, should not prove a detriment in any way as it cuts the park along the north limit of the level usable land, leaving only ravines and excessively steen grades to the north.

As the paving would not be undertaken until next year, it would not be necessary for the Corporation or the Oil Companies to provide this portion of the cost until 1954. Our share from this year's estimate would then amount to about \$4,000.

A short section at the east end of the project could also be deferred until Imperial Oil have decided on their future plans, as this section would serve no other interested party.

It is felt that the Corporation's interest in this project is equal to

It is felt that the Corporation's interest in this project is equal to the expenditure proposed above and the Engineer would recommend that the project be authorized and the expenditure of approximately \$4,000. from 1953 estimates be made, with the remaining \$1,200. provided in the coming year; the recommendations subject to receipt of written uniertaking on the part of both parties.

The only condition imposed by the Companies is that the gravel road be in service this fall and that the pavement be completed early next year. Moved by Councillor Charlton and seconied by Councillor Isherwood That the recommendation of the Engineer be adopted.
