## Monday, July, 26, 1954

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A regular meeting of the Municipal Council was held at the Mufficipal Hall, 1930 Kingsway, on Monday, July 26, 1954 an 7.30 p.m. Present: Reeve MacSorley in Chair; Councillors W.P.Philps, Wilks, Charlton, Henn, Hughes, F.Philps and Morrison.
