

Tuesday, October 11, 1955.

An adjourned meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, 1930 Kingsway, on Tuesday, October 11, 1955 at 7.30 p.m.

Present: Reeve MacSorley in the Chair; Crs. W.P.Philps, Charlton, Drummond, Hughes, Hean, Morrison and F.Philps.

A Public Hearing was held into the proposed passage of "Burnaby Town Planning By-law 1948, Amendment By-law No. 4, 1955".

Mr.Keith appeared as Solicitor for the owners of Block 3, J.L.153 and objected to rezoning of the said block, save and except the North fourteen feet, on the grounds that it was his understanding that the rezoning of the property would constitute a formal dedication of the north fourteen feet of the property for road purposes.

The Solicitor submitted that his clients did not wish to pre-judge the present use of the property by agreeing to such rezoning and road dedication pointing out that if the pending deal for the property failed to materialize completely their present auto court operations on the property would be materially jeopardized.

Mr.Wallace appeared on behalf of Newcombe Realty, applicants for the rezoning and advised that his firm was the holder of an option to purchase and that full consent of the owner to rezoning, save and except the north fourteen feet, had been obtained.

The Solicitor and the agent returned later in the Hearing and withdrew any objections to the rezoning in view of their having received assurance that no Fire Limits By-law was in force in the Municipality.

No objections or other representations were made in respect of any of the proposed rezonings included in the subject by-law.

Moved by Cr. W.P.Philps, seconded by Cr.Hean "That the minutes of the previous meeting be adopted as written and confirmed." Carried Unanimously.

2 Patricia M. Fahlman, Solicitor, wrote requesting an opportunity to speak to the Council. Mrs. Fahlman appeared and spoke on behalf of the owner of property described Lots 1 and 5 to 9 incl., part Lot 1, Block 13 and part Lot 1, Block 14, D.L.79, submitting that her client had been refused building permits to erect dwellings on five of these lots, the reasons being that some question as to suitability of the property from a sanitation point of view prevailed. Moved by Cr.Morrison, seconded by Cr.Hean "That the Solicitor be thanked and that this matter be referred to the Chief Sanitary Inspector and Chief Building Inspector for report." Carried Unanimously.

3 Mrs. Corol Cameron wrote requesting an opportunity to speak to the Council with regard to the location of the Kensington Junior High School. Mrs. Cameron appeared. Moved by Cr. W.P.Philps, seconded by Cr.Hughes "That Mrs.Cameron be heard." Carried Unanimously.

Mrs. Cameron objected to the location of the Kensington Avenue School site and was advised to make representation to the Burnaby School Board which Board has jurisdiction over the location and maintenance of all schools in the Municipality.

William Turner wrote requesting an opportunity to speak to the Council with regard to the Municipal Land Sales Policy. Moved by Cr.Hean, seconded by Cr.Morrison "That Mr.Turner be heard." Carried Unanimously.

4 Mr.Turner submitted that the recent Probe into methods of selling Municipal land had arisen out of concern by the Ratepayers over the sale of lands by the Municipality at too cheap a rate. Mr. Turner submitted that the recent probe had been inadequate and suggested that an investigation be made into the Land Sale Policy by a Citizen's Committee and that all land sales should be suspended pending an investigation and airing of the policy by the Council. Moved by Cr.Hean, seconded by Cr.Drummond "That Mr.Turner be thanked for his presentation." Carried Unanimously.

5 Parkcrest Ratepayers' Association submitted an application for a grant to assist financially in arrangements for their Children's Halloween party.

6 Leaside and District Ratepayers' Association submitted an application for a Grant to assist in the financing of a Halloween celebration. Moved by Cr.W.P.Philps, seconded by Cr.Hean "That the applications be received and referred to a Committee on Grants for recommendation." Carried Unanimously.

1 Edmonds Old Age Pensioners Organization submitted an application for a grant toward their forthcoming Christmas Dinner. Moved by Cr. W.P. Philips, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That the application be referred to the Committee on Grants for recommendation."
Carried Unanimously.

2 Burnaby Library Board submitted a request that they be granted funds to conduct a Publicity Campaign in connection with the presentation of a Library By-law at the forthcoming election. Moved by Cr. Hean, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That the letter be received and referred to the Municipal Solicitor for report."
Carried Unanimously.

3 Burnaby May Day Association wrote advising that their Association had over-expended the allotted monies for the Float entry made jointly by their Association and the Council in the 1955 PNE parade. The Association advised that of a deficit of \$322.21 (\$322.21) \$165.00 had to be borne personally by members of their organization. The Association requested that the Council consider increasing its contribution to the Float by the amount of \$165.00. Moved by Cr. W.P. Philips, seconded by Cr. Drummond "That the letter be received and the request for an increased grant in the sum of \$165.00 be granted."
Carried Unanimously.

4 Shell Oil Company of Canada wrote advising that they were prepared to convey the south thirty-three feet of Block 42, J.L.142 extending from Underhill Avenue west to a distance of 907 feet to the Municipality for the sum of \$1,095.00 being the price based upon actual cost per acre including out-of-pocket expenses paid by their Company for the last piece of property purchased from the Municipality in this area.
Moved by Cr. W.P. Philips, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That the Engineer be requested to provide information as to the necessity of acquiring this land for the widening of Broadway at this time."
Carried Unanimously.

5 Sister Superior, Seton Academy submitted a request for a building permit to erect an addition to the Academy in North Burnaby. The Council was advised that this application was necessary under Section 9 (b) of the Town Planning By-law which provides for the erection of Public Schools in duplex and single family zones and that there was some doubt as to whether or not this academy fell within the classification of Public Schools. Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. Hean "That the application be received and referred to the Chief Building Inspector and Municipal Solicitor for report."
Carried Unanimously.

6 Carmel Construction Company submitted an application on behalf of Brantford Coach and Body Company Limited for permission to carry on an industry at Block 5, J.L.169 for the assembly of truck bodies and service and installation of all types of truck bodies. Council was advised that permission was necessary under Section 11 (e) of the Town Planning By-law before a permit could be granted for the establishment of an automobile or auto body manufacturing plant ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ in a Light Industrial zone.
Moved by Cr. Drummond, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That the application as requested be granted."
Carried Unanimously.

7 Milne and Ellis, Barristers and Solicitors, submitted a claim for damages on behalf of their client, Raymond B. McCarthy who alleged that certain damage had been caused to his home and property described as North 66' Block 16, of Block 39, J.L.189 as a result of the construction of the road allowance of Glynde Avenue, past his property.
Moved by Cr. W.P. Philips, seconded by Cr. Charlton "That the letter be received and referred to the Municipal Solicitor."
Carried Unanimously.

1 The Board of Transport Commissioners for Canada wrote with reference to the application of the Council for an Order of their Board to permit construction of pedestrian crossings over the tracks of the C.P.R. to provide access to a proposed park site at Parnet Beach, advising that their Board was in agreement with the views of the Railway Company that no suitable type of protection could be devised and installed to permit of a level pedestrian crossing which would be reasonable free of hazard. The Board advised further that they were not prepared to give further consideration to the application until such time as the Municipality was prepared to accept the necessity of providing a grade separation at this point.

Moved by Cr. F. Philips, seconded by Cr. Drummond "That the letter be received."
Carried Unanimously.

2 E.M. Bryenton submitted a complaint with regard to a large fir tree across the lane adjoining his property which was considered to be hazardous, requesting that steps be taken by the Council to have this hazard removed.

Moved by Cr. Hean, seconded by Cr. F. Philips "That the letter be received and this matter be referred to the Chief Executive Officer for investigation and whatever action is deemed necessary."

Carried Unanimously.

3 Burnaby Ratepayers' Council wrote with reference to an alleged traffic hazard existing at the point where Rumble Street meets the intersection of 19th Street and 21st Avenue pointing out that the awkward curve in the road at this point would be aggravated when the new Safeway Store at Edmonds and Kings was opened shortly.

Moved by Cr. Hughes, seconded by Cr. Drummond "That the letter be received and the matter be referred to the Traffic and Traffic Safety Committee and the Municipal Engineer for report."

Carried Unanimously.

4 Burnaby Ratepayers' Council wrote expressing favour with the recent stand taken by the Municipal Council in connection with the provision of temporary sewage disposal units in the Municipality.

Moved by Cr. W.P. Philips, seconded by Cr. Drummond "That the letter be received."

Carried Unanimously.

5 Burnaby General Hospital submitted a request that the council arrange for the sale of outstanding debentures covered by By-law 3519 so that necessary plans may be laid for the commencing of construction of the Hospital addition early in 1956.

Moved by Cr. Hughes, seconded by Cr. W.P. Philips "That this matter be referred to a Committee of the Reeve, Chairman of Finance and Municipal Treasurer for report."

Carried Unanimously.

6 General Manager, Transportation, B.C. Electric Railway Co. Limited wrote with reference to a Petition received some time ago for a diversion of the Burnaby Stride bus to serve a portion of the South Slope area, advising that in taking all factors into consideration, including the terrain of the area, the present spacing of stops, the rider potential in the area, it was considered that the proposed extension would prove impractical.

Moved by Cr. Drummond, seconded by Cr. Hean "That the letter be received and the information contained therein be relayed to the petitioners."

Carried Unanimously.

7 South Burnaby Board of Trade submitted advice of a meeting arranged for the evening of October 20th to hear a report of the Committee on the best available site for a TV transmission tower on Burnaby Mountain and extending an invitation to a delegate from the Council to attend.

Moved by Cr. Drummond, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That Councillor Charlton be a delegate from this Council to the Board of Trade meeting."

Carried Unanimously.

8 Central Burnaby Ratepayers and Citizens Committee submitted advice of a meeting of their Association to be held Thursday, October 13th at which time the main topic of discussion would be the question of fluoridation. The Association extended an invitation to the Council to be present.

Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. Hughes "That the invitation be received and those Councillors who are able be in attendance at this meeting."

Carried Unanimously.

9 The Vancouver Council of Social engineering submitted a copy of a letter forwarded to the Mayor and City Council of the City of Vancouver on the question of fluoridation of the water supply in the Vancouver area.

Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. Hughes "That the letter be received."

Carried Unanimously.

The Mission-Matsqui Emergency Crossing Committee submitted a circular relative to the effect on the Lower Mainland, and particularly the Fraser Valley, which the breach of the Fraser River crossing at Mission had created and requesting that the Council support their appeal for:

- (1) Immediate restoration of temporary highway traffic on the existing rail-highway bridge.
- (2) Immediate commencement of planning for a modern high level traffic bridge at Mission to replace the present structure.

Moved by Cr. Hean, seconded by Cr. Hughes "That the letter be received and the ~~committee~~ matter tabled pending a report of the Regional Planning Board on the Mission Bridge situation."

Carried Unanimously.

2 The Union of B.C. Municipalities submitted correspondence exchanged between the District of Kitimat and the Assessment Commissioner in Victoria relative to the payment of ten cents per A.C.3 - Sales Analysis Forms.

Moved by Cr. W.P. Philips, seconded by Cr. F. Philips "That the letter be received."

Carried Unanimously.

Cr. Hean withdrew from the meeting.

Metropolitan Health Committee submitted minutes of the last regular meeting held September 21st, 1955.

Moved by Cr. Hughes, seconded by Cr. Drummond "That the minutes be received."

Cr. Hean returned to the meeting.

Carried Unanimously.

The Medical Health Officer submitted a request for permission for Mr. A. Brcomfield, Septic Tank Inspector, to attend the Pacific Northwest Sewage and Industrial Waste Association Convention to be held in Victoria on October 27th to 29th.

The Municipal Engineer requested permission for Mr. J.W. Milne, Sewer Superintendent and Mr. V. Kennedy, Assistant Engineer (Sewers), to attend the same conference.

Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. F. Philips "That permission as requested by the Medical Health Officer and Engineer be granted."

Carried Unanimously.

Civil Defence Co-ordinator submitted a request that he be permitted to attend a Civil Defence Evacuation Study at the Civil Defence College, Arran, Ontario from December 12th to 16th, as a representative of the Vancouver Target Area, all costs to be borne by the Federal Government.

Moved by Cr. Charlton, seconded by Cr. W.P. Philips "That permission be granted as requested."

Carried Unanimously.

3 The Municipal Solicitor submitted a report with respect to the lease of Pol. 1 (Expt. plan 14377) Lot 4 of Lot 153, Plan 783 to the Astor Hotel Limited advising that the said lease contained a covenant that the Hotel Company could not assign the lease without the consent of the Municipality and the Solicitor advised that the Lease formed part of the assets of the Company which is charged by way of mortgage in favour of the Royal Trust Company as Trustee for the holders of the Hotel Company's debentures. The Solicitor now required that the consent of the Municipality to the assignment of the lease by way of mortgage contained in the debenture trust deed be secured. The Solicitor requested that council authority be obtained to execute this consent.

Moved by Cr. W.P. Philips, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That the necessary consent to assign the said lease be granted."

Carried Unanimously.

4 The Chief Administrative Officer submitted a report on an offer received from Bernard Lundeen to pay this Corporation the sum of \$30.00 for the privilege of demolishing House No. 8, 9, 19 and 20 in Barnet Village recommending that Mr. Lundeen's offer be accepted subject to the usual safeguards in this regard.

Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. Drummond "That the recommendation of the Chief Administrative Officer be adopted."

Carried Unanimously.

The Municipal Clerk reported that a number of new streets had been created through the subdivision of lands in the Municipality and recommended that a Street Naming By-law be brought down to officially name

Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. Hean "That the recommendations of the Municipal Clerk be adopted and the necessary By-law be brought down."

Carried Unanimously.

The Municipal Clerk submitted a report on the proposal of the Council to pass a Fireworks By-law to prohibit the setting off of fireworks in a public place without a permit and (2) prohibit the selling of fireworks to persons under the age of 16 years.

The Solicitor gave the opinion that Council could enact the first clause pursuant to Section 158 (175) of the Municipal Act. However, it was his opinion that the Council did not have the power to enact the second clause, and that while the said clause had given the Council power to regulate the sale of fireworks to minors, it did not expressly provide for the prohibition of sale to minors.

Moved by Cr. Charlton, seconded by Cr. W.P. Philips "That the report be received."

Carried Unanimously.

Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. Hean "That the question of prohibiting the sale of fireworks to minors be referred to the Municipal Affairs Committee of the U.B.C.M. to take up with the Provincial Government with a view to bringing about an amendment to the Municipal Act which would allow for this prohibition."

Carried Unanimously.

Peter Krutow wrote requesting permission to convert his premises at 4107 Willingdon Avenue to a duplex classification pointing out that he had commenced conversion of the building to this classification prior to the recent passage of the Town Planning By-law amendment providing for specific lot measurements for duplex buildings without which he was unable to build. The applicant requested a permit to complete the conversion of this building as desired.

The Building Inspector reported that an application had been made by an electrical contractor for a permit to install the necessary wiring to a second suite in these premises - Lot "A", S.D.2, Blk.16, D.L.33 and that a survey of records revealed no building permit had been taken out covering the conversion to duplex of the said premises. The Building Inspector reported that the owner had been notified of his violation of municipal regulations and that he was subject to prosecution under the by-laws of the Municipality. It was further reported that the owner had been requested for a plan covering the structural alterations with a view to issuing permits only for work indicating single family occupancy. Upon submission of the plans, building and wiring permits were issued for the alterations which included a change of partitions on lower and upper floors as well as re-location of plumbing facilities all of which were granted on the basis of single family occupancy.

Moved by Cr. Hughes, seconded by Cr. Hean "That the report of the building Inspector be received."

Carried Unanimously.

The Parks Advisory Committee submitted a report on the application of Standard Oil Company of Canada to purchase Lot 3, Block "G", J.L.188 as a site for an administration building, advising that it was the opinion of the Committee that this property was not required for inclusion in Confederation Park.

Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. F. Philips "That the report be received and referred to the Staff Land Sale Committee."

Carried Unanimously.

The Social Service Administrator submitted a report covering the activities of his Department for the period January 1st to September 30th, 1955.

Officer-in-Charge, Burnaby Detachment, R.C.M.P. submitted a report on policing activities for the month of September, 1955.

The Special Committee appointed to bring down a report with regard to the regulation of signs in the Municipality submitted a recommendation that the Solicitor be instructed to bring down a by-law for the regulation of signs in all zones of the Municipality. The Committee further reported on the application of Industrial Engineering Limited for a permit to erect a sign within the 60' residential buffer strip at the south-west corner of Bainbridge Avenue and Loughheed Highway, submitting a recommendation that the application be approved in principle, and that formal approval be granted since it is possible for Council to do so. It was further recommended that the present sign restrictions as to size be retained in residential areas subject to the right of appeal to the Town Planning Board of Appeal for approval or disapproval of the erection of any sign in such areas.
