The clerk now reported that the property was situated on Marine Drive. approximately 200 west of Nelson Avenue and contained a frontage of 123 on Marine Drive with a depth of some 60'.

Moved by Cr.F.Philps, seconded by Cr. Hean "That the recommendation of the Town Planning Commission to not approve the application, due to the unsatisfactory shape and saze of the property be adopted." Carried Unanimously.

The Meeting then adjourned until Monday, May 9th at 7.30 p.m.
