A regular meeting of the Wunicipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, 1930 Kingsway, on Monday, April 23, 1956 at 7.30 p.m.

Present: Reeve MacScrley in the Chair; Crs. W.P.Philps, Charlton, Orumnond, Hean Hughes, F.Philps and Mcrrison.

Rev. T.L. Hipp opened the meeting with Prayer.

J. Turner of the Constituency Committee of the Labour Progressive Party, - attended and requested an opportunity to address the Council.

Mr. Turner spoke with reference to the recent increase in the mill rate resulting in a general increase in taxation, protesting the said increase, pointing out that recent legislation establishing an equalization of assessments had not brought about relief to the taxpayers as was promised. It was suggested by the spokesman that education costs were paramount in the Municipal buiget and were increasing annually. Mr. Turner submitted that the Council should bring pressure to bear upon the Provincial and Federal Governments to have these higher govern—ment administrations absorb a larger share of costs of school administration. The spokesman deployed the rising mill rate and urged that the Council guard against a repetition of the Municipal liquidation of the 1930's and suggested that steps be taken to guarantee that there would not be opportunity for such requirement. Mr. Turner referred to certain statements made in past years inrecurrence. Mr. Turner referred to certain statements made in past years in-dicating that additional industrial assessments would relief the tax burden upon the home owner and suggested that this had not transpired. In summerizing, Mr. Turner urged the Council to:

(1) Lodge a protest with the Federal Government with respect to taxation costs and request that the Senior Envernments absorb

(2) The Council immediately lower exemption on industry from 60 to 75%.

Moved by Cr. Hughes, seconded by Cr. Hean That the speaker be thanked for his submission. Cassica Unanimously.

Dania Home wrote advising of plans for an additional Wing to their home at 4205 Douglas Foad involving a capital expenditure of \$35,000.00 ani requesting an opportunity to appear before the Council to solicit a grant for their building programme. The Traffic Engineer, Jepartment of Highways, wrote sivising of plans of their Department to provide extra circuits in the Kingsway lighting system so that the traffic signals could be inter-connected. The Traffic Engineer pointed out that at present stor and go signals were operating on a 24 hour a day basis and that such practice was undesirable due to the insufficient flow of traffic during night hours. It was also mentioned that the present signals are not inter-connected and that present power failures created a situation where the time progression of the signals was upset and each signal was required to be manually set upon the re-introduction of power. The Engineer sivised that the work planned to change the system to flash operation at night and to provide the necessary connections would require extra equipment to a value of approximately \$900.00, one half share of the cost of this equipment being requested by the Traffic Engineer.

# Report of Town Planning Commission.

The Town Planning Commission submitted a report of their regular meeting held on Arril 13th, 1956 when the following applications for rescning were considered:

1. Application of McMaster, Boyle, & Parkes on behalf of J.W. and J.E. Chalmers, for rezoning of Lo+s 3 and 4 of "M", Block 3, ).L.7482 from Residential Single Family to Gasoline Service station.

The subject property is located on the east side of Poyal Oak Avenue immediately north of Fulwell Street and Hardwick Park. At its meet-

The subject property is located on the east side of Toyal Oak Avenue immediately north of Fulwell Street and Hardwick Park. At its meeting February 23rd, 1956, the Town Planning Commission considered an application to rezone the subject property for Commercial use and recommende that the application for such use not be approved, because development of shopping facilities on this site would worsen traffic conditions on the Grandview Highway in the vicinity of intensifying an existing parking problem.

The applicants have since alvised that the intended use of the property is for Gasoline Service Station, and to develop the site for this purpose they are prepared to demolish the existing shop and dwelling.

The Town Planning Commission is of the opinion that Gasoline Service Station usage would be an amenable use for this property by reducing the present parking condition on the border of the Highway and by not detrimentally effecting the values of any existing surrounding property.

The Town Planning Commission would recommend that the above described property be approved for rescning from Residential Single Family to Gasoline Service Station, and would draw Council's attention to the applicants' assurance of demolishing the existing improvements on the property.

Moved by Cr. Mcrrison, seconded by Cr. F.Philps That Item 1 be approved for further consideration. Carried Unanimously.

(2) Application of Carl Troseth, 3550 Willington Avenue, for the rezoning of Lot 6, Block 68, 0.L.33, Plan 8115, from Residential Two Family to Residential Multiple Family or Gasoline Service station.

The Town Planning Commission has considered this application at length and is of the unanimous opinion that any change of scring for other land use of this parcel would be premature at this time.

Peasons for this opinion are:

- (a) This site is a portion of a large block of land surrounded by Willington Avenue, Grange Street, Chaffey Avenue and Furke Street. The fringe of this block is developed with houses which effectively "lock" off the interior from higher Residential 'development, Commercialization at this time of any portion of the fringe would strengthen this "locking" effect and unnecessarily delay the opening up and development of the interior of this block.
- (b) Rezoning of the subject property at this time would medicate the opening of Grange Street east of Willington Avenue by inflating property values to such an extent that road acquisition and development might be uneconcurred. The opening of Grange Street east of Willington Avenue is considered necessary for the orderly and continuing development of the Kingsway business district.

(c) At the present time \*raffic in this vicinity is adequately served by two Gascline Service Stations some 500 feet south of the subject property.

In view of the foregoing con)itions, the Tewn Planning Commission would recommend that no change of zoning of the above described property be considered at this time.

Mrs. Treath appeared and requested an opportunity to speak.

Moved by Cr. Charlton, seconded by Cr.Morrison "That Mrs. Troseth be heard."

Mrs. Troseth advised that requests had been made for portions of land for the widening of Willington Avenue and Grange Street and that they would be willing to convey the said portions. (3) Application of John E. Milne for rezoning property at 204 S.Alpha Ave., Lot "A" Block 2, ).L.122, from Residential Two Family to Residential Multiple Family.

It is the feeling of the Town Planning Commission that the general area has certain characteristics which point to its eventual suitability as a Residential Multiple Family District, but piecemeal re-development for Residential Multiple Family use would only lead to a mean, low value area. It is apparent that a comprehensive re-development scheme should be undertaken.

The site of the subject parcel presents a very awkward development problem if its development were undertaken in isolation. Furthermore, any isolated development on the subject property would likely have a detrimental effect on the abutting Confederation Park area.

The Town Planning Commission would recommend that this application not be approved, but would welcome the opportunity to give further study of the re-levelopment possibilities of the general area south of Confederation Park to Hastings Street.
