A regular meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, 1930 Kingsway, on Monday, January 9, 1956 at 7.30 p.m.

Present: Reeve MacSorley in the Chair; Councillors W. P. Philps, Charlton, Jrummond F. Philps, and Morrison.

Pev. L. J. Hankinson led in the Opening Prayer.

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Canadian Temple of the More Abundant Life wrote with reference to their application for relief from payment of tax penalties requesting an apportunity for a delgation to speak to the Council relative to this matter. The delegation appeared.

Moved by Cr. W. P. Philps, seconded by Cr. Jrummond "That the delegation be heard."

Carried Unanimously.

The spokesman for the delegation appealed to the Council for relaxation in the regulations concerning tax penalties. The speaker admitted that his erganization was somewhat at fault in not complying with the deadline for tax payments but the reason for non-payment was that tax notices had not been received. A request was again placed before the Council to pass a Resolution relaxing the regulation applicable to payment of tax penalties. It was pointed out that the organization was dedicated to humanitarian purposes and was a non-profit erganization.

Counciller W. P. Philps advised the delegation that the Council did not have the required authority to rebate such penalties and further that to hencur the Temple's request would set a dangerous precedent in that similar applications from individual tax-payers would have to be entertained. Mr. Philps expressed surprise at the stand taken by Provincial Government efficials when they advised they would be prepared to recommend the necessary Order-in-Council if the Municipal Council passed the appropriate resolution.

Moved by Cr. W. P. Philps, seconded by Cr. Charleon "That the delegation be thanked for their appearance and that the Temple be advised of the impossibility of the Council to grant their request."

Carried Unanimously.

Secretary, North Burnaby Beard of Trade wrate advising of the adoption of a Resolution by their Beard concerning the widening of Hastings Street and requesting an eppertunity for the President of the Beard to speak to the Council in this regard.

The delegation appeared.

Meved by Cr. Merrisen, seconded by Cr. W. P. Philps "That the spokesman for the delegation be heard."

Carried Unanimously.

Mr. Tem Blake speke addressing the Council, stressing the urgency of read widening imprevements along Hastings Street, pointing out that the present situation was a detriment to the commercial espansion. It was the contention of the spekesman that the amount of work done on the widening project was small in proportion to the area served. It was submitted that the problem was primarily a Municipality responsibility and that the Council should proceed regardless of whether or not support was forthcoming from the Provincial Government.

The spekesman made the fellowing three requests:

- (1). That the Council proceed immediately on its own responsibility to obtain the required right-of-way.
- (2) That an appropriation of Two hundred thousand dellars (\$200,000,00) be set up during 1958 in addition to the Ferty-five thousand della rs (\$45,000,00) appropriated in 1955.
- (3) That an ever-all comprehensive plan of development be prepared along East Hastings Street from Boundary Road to Cliff Avenue.

Meved by Cr. W. P. Philps, seconded by Cr. Charlten "That the delegation be thanked for their appearance and that the Beard be advised that the submissions made would be taken into full consideration."

Carried Unanimously.

Reyal Oak Old Age Pensieners' Organisation submitted a request that an approach be made by the Council to the B.C. Electric requesting the reuting of a bus nearer the Burnaby General Hespital during hespital visiting heurs.
