A regular meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Municipal Hall, 4545 East Grandview-Douglas Highway, on Monday, June 16, 1958 at 7:30 p.m.

PRESENT:

Reeve Emmott in the Chair; Councillors Brown, Cafferky, Jamieson, Mather, McLean, Seifner and Wilson

Reverend Hipp led in Opening Prayer.

Moved by Councillor Brown, Seconded by Councillor Wilson: "That the Minutes of the previous meeting be adopted as written and confirmed."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Mr. A. H. Hill wrote requesting that he be given the opportunity to address Council in respect of a proposal of Council to initiate a number of road paving and sidewalk projects.

Moved by Councillor Jamieson, Seconded by Councillor McLean: "That the delegation be heard."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Mr. Hill appeared and advised that it was the opinion of the ratepayers that a hardship would be worked upon them by virtue of the cost sharing arrangement proposed for these projects. Mr. Hill requested that Council meet with a Committee of ratepayers to discuss the situation with a view to considering some other method of financing these local improvement works.

Moved by Councillor Brown, Seconded by Councillor Cafferky: "That the delegation be thanked for the presentation."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Mr. J. H. Currie, Chairman, Chancellor Subdivision Committee, submitted a letter inquiring as to what progress had been made to date on the matter of the Access Road to the Chancellor Subdivision and requesting that he be allowed the opportunity of appearing before Council to discuss the matter further. Municipal Engineer submitted a report in connection with this matter advising that the Corporation is responsible for the frontage road of the Chancellor Subdivision but that due to the paucity of development between Fell Avenue and Holdom Avenue construction had not been authorized for the extension of this road to its two extremities. The Engineer further reported that his Department will shortly be commencing construction of the road in question from its present western terminus to Fell Avenue and also Fell Avenue northward to Broadway. The Municipal Engineer also advised that the Planning Department is at the present time investigating the matter of access to the Subdivision at its eastern end and pointed out that from the standpoint of residential amenities and traffic movements it would not be advisable to project the frontage road directly onto the Lougheed Highway and added that it would probably be some time before an eastern access road is provided. The Engineer further reported that the construction of a reasonable outlet by way of Fell Avenue would create a great difference to the efficient movement of local traffic to and from the Subdivision and felt that the problems peculiar to this Subdivision could be best assessed when the aforementioned works have been completed and the effect enjoyed for a short period.

Moved by Councillor Cafferky, Seconded by Councillor Jamieson: "That the delegation be heard."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Electric Railway Company Limited over the north 30 feet of Lot 1, Block 26, D.L. 68, Plan 11556, advising that the Hospital had informed him the Company had not utilized its existing Easement over the northerly 33 feet of the westerly 275.2 feet of said Lot 1 and that the Company required the new Easement to enable it to bring power to the Hospital. The Manager recommended that the existing Easement be cancelled and that a new Indenture of Easement embodying the same conditions as the original Easement be granted to the Company in question covering the aforesaid north 30 feet.

The Manager stated it was his opinion that if the time comes when all parks in the Lower Mainland are placed under a Metropolitan body, Central Park would be in the same position as any other Park either in the City or in Burnaby. The Manager respectfully requested approval of the surrender of the existing Lease and authority to execute the new one.

- The purchase of the back portion by the Municipality following subdivision at a reasonable price synonymous with that paid by the owners to the Municipality originally.
- 2. A proposal to make available the entire holdings of the applicants to the 0il Company in question.

And that the Solicitor for the applicants had informed him they would not be prepared to consider any offer for the property based on the original price at the time the owners secured the property from the Municipality but that they would be prepared to sell the rear portion at a fair market value to be determined by an independent appraiser. The Manager also advised that the Solicitor for the applicants had stated the Oil Company did not desire to purchase any more of the property than that which is under negotiation at the present time.

Edwards, Edwards and Edwards submitted a letter relative to the above matter requesting that he be allowed to address Council on this matter.

Moved by Councillor Cafferky, Seconded by Councillor Wilson: "That Mr. Edwards be heard."

Mr. Edwards appeared and voiced his objection to the suggestion of Council that the property be repurchased at its original price and also the second suggestion concerning the Oil Company buying the whole property. Mr. Edwards requested that the alternate proposal, as presented previously, concerning the dedication of a road allowance from the westerly side of the property be endorsed by Council.
