Equipment Operator IV-a includes five cents (.05¢) per hour spread over the entire year in lieu of special services performed because of the present lack of foremen personnel.

The Manager recommended that the agreement be signed by the Reeve and the Clerk and that the Corporate Seal be affixed thereto."

Councillor Cafferky laid before the Committee proposal of the School Board to submit School By-law to the electors at the forthcoming Municipal Election and recommended that the Council support the principle of the By-Law."

The Chairman, Safety Committee submitted a report relative to the use of fire fighting equipment for purposes other than the fighting of fires advising that this matter was thoroughly discussed with the Municipal Manager, Fire Chief, Treasurer and Personnel Manager and it was revealed that the members of the Fire Department staff would be protected by compensation liability insurance in the event of an accident occurring at any time they were injured on Municipal duty regardless of whether it be their usual type of work. The Chairman added that both the Fire Chief and Manager shared his opinion that the use of fire fighting equipment for purposes other than that for which it is purchased and maintained is undesirable. The Chairman pointed out that the present strength of equipment and manpower in the Department is below the standard set by the fire writers Association and also he felt the efficiency of the equipment may be impaired due to delays encountered by having to restore equipment to its normal usage before proceeding to a conflagration. The Chairman reported it was his opinion that fire fighting equipment should be maintained at peek efficiency and in readiness at all times in the interest of the life and property of the citizens of the Municipality and that all practical steps should be taken to ensure that nothing interferes with that efficiency. He recommended that the use of fire fighting equipment owned by the Corporation for purposes other than the fighting of fires be prohibited except in the case of emergency where life and property may be endangered by circumstances other than that occasioned by fire.

Moved by Councillor Jamieson, S conded by Councillor Cafferky: "That the Council resolve itself into Committee of the Whole to discuss this report."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Moved by Councillor Cafferky, Seconded by Councillor Wilson: "That the use of fire fighting equipment for purposes other than the fighting of fires be not permitted, except in cases of emergency, where life and property may be endangered by circumstances other than that occasioned by fire or, after

uddrighted written application for sanction by the Council."

Moved by Councillor Cafferky, Seconded by Councillor Jamieson: "That the Committee do now rise and report the above resolution as approved by the Committee to Council.

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

The Council reconvened.
