An Adjourned meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall on Monday, November 24, 1958 at 7:30 p.m.

Secretary, Civic Bureau, Vancouver Board of Trade -advising of a meeting held November 10, 1958 at which time the subject, Metropolitan Housing Survey, was discussed. Attached to the correspondence were copies of the minutes of this meeting, including the following resolution adopted unanimously by the meeting:

"Since it is the concensus of the Metropolitan Housing Survey meeting called by the Vancouver Board of Trade on November 10, 1958, it is therefore resolved that there is a need for a Metropolitan Housing Study to be undertaken in the Greater Vancouver Metropolitan area and that the representatives of the Municipalities and Civic organizations in attendance report back to their respective parties with a view to requesting that such a study of future housing requirements for the whole Metropolitan area be initiated by Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation as provided under the National Housing Act. Furthermore it is considered that in the absence of an appropriate Metropolitan Government agency that the B. C. Research Council is probably the Organization best equipped to actually conduct the investigation."

Moved by Councillor Jamieson, Seconded by Councillor Brown: "That the Corporation of the District of Burnaby concurs with this resolution."

Administrator, Burnaby General Hospital, advising of a temporar hazardous parking situation adjacent to the Burnaby General Hospital. This situation has arisen as a result of electrical work now in process which will bring a new power line to the Hospital. The Executive now requests that these works be left in abeyance until such time as this electrical work has been completed. It was further requested that temporary parking restriction be put into effect at the four corners of Ingleton and Sunset Streets.

Moved by Councillor Wilson, Seconded by Councillor Brown: "That a request for an increase in strength of the Burnaby force of sixteen men be made to the R.C.M.P. Headquarters."

The particulars of the precise were substantially as shown in Item (3) of Report No. 36 of the Municipal Manager, dated November 21st. Considerable discussion ensued on the advisability of establishing a limited dividend housing project in the area and also on the degree of servicing which should be demanded by developers interested.

Ornamental Lighting.

Adequate paved access roads (2) (3)

Adequate pedestrian facilities where necessary.

(4) (5) Storm and Sanitary sewers.

Curbs.

Water mains.

His Worship the Reeve reported verbally on the application of the Junior Chamber of Commerce for a small grant in aid in arrangements for a public rally when candidates for the forthcoming Municipal Election would be heard, recommending that the sum of \$20.00 be granted to the Junior Chamber of Commerce for this purpose.

Moved by Councillor Wilson, Seconded by Councillor McLean: "That the recommendation of the Reeve be adopted."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

His Worship the Reeve reported further on an application received from the Canadian National Institute for the Blind for a grant in aid advising that since this Organization was included amongst the agencies of the Community Chest Organization, and since Burnaby was now covered by that Organization that the individual grant application from the Institute be denied.
