President, Metropolitan Television Limited, wrote requesting Council to approve in principle the granting of a competitive independent television licence for the Greater Vancouver area.

Moved by Councillor McLean, seconded by Councillor MacSorley "That this request be tabled until after the meeting with the City of Vancouver on October 6th to discuss the general question of commercial television stations in the Lower Mainland area, had been held."

Carried Unanimously.

F. Hartley submitted a letter on behalf of himself, D. Baxter, A. lannuci and Mr. F. Hartley submitted a letter on behalf of himself, D. Baxter, A. lannuci and H. Clayton thanking the Reeve for addressing them recently on the matter of Hastings Street Widening, suggesting that a meeting be arranged with authorities in Victoria to determine whether some joint action could be undertaken which would relieve the

problem. Moved by Councillor Edwards, seconded by Councillor Prittie "That the Municipal Manager be directed to submit a report as to the ratio of tax returns which have accrued to the Municipality as a result of widening the other portion of Hastings Street, and that following receipt of this information, a meeting be arranged between representatives of the North Burnaby merchants and Council so that an exchange of views can be made with respect to the Hastings Street widening question."

Carried Unanimously.

Councillor Edwards absented himself from the meeting.

Carried Unanimously.

Community Arts Council of Vancouver submitted an invitation to attend the opening of the Street Furniture Exhibition on October 6th together with a circular letter advising that this exhibit will be displayed for the two week period between October 7th and 22nd.

Moved by Councillor Mather, seconded by Councillor Prittie "That the invitation be received and the Community Arts Council advised of the commitment by this Council with the New Westminster Council on October 6th, and that our members will endeavour to inspect the display some time during the aforementioned two week period."

Secretary, Burnaby Ratepayers' Council wrote inquiring as to the situation respecting the installation of overhead transmission lines and suggesting that Council impel itself to seek legislative changes in order to overcome the financial burden which is presently imposed on the Municipality by virtue of existing legislation. District and further, that copies of the letter be made to each member of Council." Carried Unanimously.

J. F. Bateman submitted a letter suggesting that Ingleton Avenue between the lane south of Parker Street and Douglas Road be developed for vehicular traffic. of Parker Street and Douglas Road be developed for vehicular traffic. The Municipal Manager submitted a report he had received from the Municipal Engineer on this matter advising that the usefulness of this street as a means of access to abutting properties is insignificant, and its value as a traffic route is only minor since there are good paved roads (McDonald Avenue and Gilmore Avenue) close by. It was further re-ported that it is doubtless troethat the subject street remained unopened due to a lack of capital funds, that it is still difficult to justify such capital expenditures in the face of the heavy demand for improvement of services throughout the Municipality, and therefore the obvious solution would be to turn to Local Improvement methods for imtherefore the obvious solution would be to turn to Local improvement methods for proving the road in question.

Moved by Councillor Jamieson, seconded by Councillor Edwards "That this matter be tabled for one week and a report be obtained as to the estimated cost of constructing the subiect road."

Carried Unanimously.

Secretary, Lozells Community Association, submitted a letter inquiring as to what action would be taken with respect to permanent improvement of Greenwood Street, Phillips Avenue and Brighton Avenue. A report was received from the Municipal Engineer on this matter advising that his Depart-

ment could recommend that only the following streets be considered for Local Improvement Initiative paving:

 (a) Phillips Avenue from Government Street to Lougheed Hwy.
 (b) Greenwood Street from Bainbridge Avenue west to Botk 5, D.L.78. (b) Greenwood Street from Bainbridge Avenue west to Bock 5, D.L./8. The report added that road foundation conditions are exceptionally poor for the remaining portion of Greenwood Street to Sperling Avenue and the road allowance is also of insuf-ficient width, and therefore, it was felt that the land acquisition and road construction costs which would be required to improve the road to a satisfactory standard could not be justified. The Engineering Department further reported that development of the Freeway and interchanges will result in the disruption of a Brighton Avenue link between Cariboo Road and Lougheed Highway, and that it would not be considered advisable to encourage traffic onto that Street for this reason, plus the fact that it is only thirty-three feet wide, and because a hazardous situation exists at the intersection with Lougheed Highway.

Moved by Councillor MacSorley, seconded by Councillor Edwards "That the letter be received and the writer advised of the situation as related in the report of the Municipal Engineer and further that the portions of Phillips Avenue and Greenwood Street above mentioned be included in the next initiative paving programme."

Carried Unanimously.

Parks and Recreation Commission submitted a copy of a Brief which is intended to be presented to the Provincial Cabinet and in which an appeal is being made by Recreation Commissions in the Lower Mainland Area for additional financial contributions from the Provincial Government for recreational facilities. The Brief pointed out the inade-quacy of the present method of granting financial aid to Local recreation commissions. The Burnaby Recreation Commission requested that Council endorse the stand taken by

the Local Recreation Commission in the Brief. Moved by Councillor Prittie, seconded by Councillor MacSorley "That this Council lend its support to the proposal as outlined in the aforementioned Brief." Carried Unanimously.

Councillor Mather submitted a report with regard to the benefits which accrue to Burnaby as a result of collections made by the NW Orphans' Christmas Fund advising that in Decem-ber, 1958, this fund issued clothing gift certificates to 331 Burnaby children; each certificate being worth \$10.00, and the recipients being children of families on Social Welfare. Councillor Mather added that the Orphans' Christmas Fund does not confine its activities to the Christmas Season and in fact, sponsors an annual Picnic in the summer. She also advised that she would have no hesitation in giving commendation to the philan-thropic activities of this Organization.

Moved by Councillor McLean, seconded by Councillor MacSorley "That the report be received." Carried Unanimously.

View obstructions caused by "Gas War". The Committee reported that Its attention had been drawn to a practice of many service station operatins of displaying prominent signs advertising the price of gasoline at strategic locations on their lots. The Committee advised that they felt some of these signs have created hazards because of the locations at which they have been placed. They added that in many cases the signs have been erected on public property beyond the limit of a service station property while in other cases, the signs have been placed at the corners of the lots. mittee reported that it was of the opinion that steps should be taken immediately to eliminate this practice and recommended that service station operators should be requested to co-operate by plackegtheir signs in positions that do not create view obstructions. They added that they felt Council should determine the means by which this can be best be achieved.

The Chairman reported verbally that subsequent to this matter coming before the Committee he had ascertained that the problem referred to was in hand and that therefore Council need not take any action on it.

Moved by Councillor Prittie, seconded by Councillor MacSorley "That the report be received."

2. Request for "School"_signs_on McKay Avenue_near Riverway_West School.

The Committee reported it has received a complaint that commercial vehicles making deliveries of building materials to a number of new homes constructed in the area around the 8000 Block McKay Avenue had created a hazard to students attending the around the 8000 Block McKay Avenue had created a hazard to students attending the above school. The Committee advised that a pedestrian count was made on September 18th which disclosed that 97 pupils travel along or cross McKay Avenue between Portland Street and Boxer Street between 8.00 a.m. and 9.00 a.m. and that during the same time, 14 vehicles used McKay Avenue. They pointed out that of these 14, 3 were commercial, 4 were private vehicles bringing children to school, and the remaining 7 were presumed to belong to local residents. The Committee purported that all in all, traffic is quite light in this area and is of a purely local na-ture, and also no conflict was observed between the pupils making the crossing and the vehicles. The Committee recommended that in view of the situation, the request be denied.

Moved by Councillor Prittie, seconded by Councillor Jamieson "That the recommendation of the Committee be adopted."
