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JANUARY 29, 1962

A Regular meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, Municipal Hall, 4545 East Grandview-Douglas Highway, on Monday, January 29, 1962 at 7:30 p.m.

<u>PRESENT</u>: Acting Reeve J. H. Edwards in the Chair; Councillors Blair, Clark, Hicks, Kalyk, MacSorley and Prittie

<u>ABSENT</u>: Reeve A. H. Emmott, Councillor Harper

Reverend G. Struthers led in Opening Prayer.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR PRITTIE, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR:

"That the Minutes of the meeting held January 15, 1962 be adopted as written and confirmed."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

A Public Hearing was held in connection with Burnaby Highway Exchange By-Law 1962 for the purpose of receiving representations for and against a proposed land exchange under this By-law. The exchange in question is one whereby Sandor Land Company Limited will convey to the Corporation the north 16½ feet of property owned by it and described as Lot 2, Block 26, D. L. 152, Plan 4932 in return for a road allowance which was formerly known as "Irvine Street" or, as recently established by the Courts, a portion of the "Kingsway" allowance.

A Mr. Docksteader, a tenant in the Medical-Dental building on the property immediately west of the subject road allowance, appeared and expressed concern that the closing of this street would result in the property of which he is a tenant being denied access to the rear. Mr. Docksteader stated that he had no objection if an alternate means of access could be provided.

Mr. W. A. Street appeared on behalf of Sandor Land Company Limited and stated that the Medical-Dental building mentioned by Mr. Docksteader does not occupy the entire property on which it is situate. He added that there is also an area on the east side of this property where vehicles can be parked and where it is possible for deliveries to be made. He also mentioned that the remnant of "Irvine Street" is currently being used as a parking area in conjunction with the aforementioned eastern part of the "Medical-Dental building" property.

As regards the concern of Mr. Docksteader, Mr. Street suggested that Mr. Docksteader determine whether a sidewalk crossing would be allowed from Kingsway at the eastern side of the "Medical-Dental building" property.

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<u>Mr. Thomas Farrington</u> submitted a letter expressing agreement with a proposal to rezone Lot "B", Blocks 43/44, D. L. 35 (Smith Avenue Nurseries) to Multiple Family use. He also suggested that the developers extend Burke Street through to Smith Avenue as a part of the development proposal.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR CLARK:

"That the letter be received and brought forward at the Public Hearing being held on this proposed rezoning on February 5, 1962."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

<u>Mr. Thomas Farrington</u> wrote a further letter expressing gratitude to the members of the Fire Department who rescued him from under a building which had fallen on him a short time ago.

Reeve Emmott submitted a report in connection with appointments to the Library Board recommending as follows:

- (a) That Messrs. T. Ryniak and L. Costley be reappointed for the term between February 1, 1962 and January 31, 1964.
- (b) That Mr. Reg Robinson, 7967 15th Avenue, be appointed for the term between February 1, 1962 and January 31, 1964, to fill the vacancy created by the term expiry of Mr. R. World.
- (c) That the Reeve be reappointed as the representative of Council for the term ending January 31, 1963.

The Reeve mentioned that Mr. World has completed three consecutive terms of office on the Board and, under the existing policy of Council, he is therefore not eligible for reappointment.

The Reeve further recommended that a letter be forwarded to Mr. World expressing the appreciation of Council for the services he has rendered to the Library Board.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY:

"That the recommendations of the Reeve be adopted."

MUNICIPAL MANAGER -- REPORT NO. 4, 1962.

(1) <u>13th Annual Conference of the Electrical Inspectors</u>¹ Association of B. C.

The Manager recommended that the Chief Building Inspector be authorized to permit the Electrical Inspectors in his Department to attend the above noted conference, which is being held in the Astor Hotel between February 22nd and 24th inclusive, at the convenience of the Department.

(2) Local Improvement Court of Revision - Sewer Utility.

The Manager recommended that Council hear appeals against the Foot-Frontage Assessment Rolls for the Sewer Utility concurrently with appeals in connection with the Local Improvement Sidewalk and Paving works on Tuesday, March 6, 1962, at 10:00 a.m.

(3) Easement - East 15 feet of Lot 7, S.D. "A", Block 47, D. L.'s 151/3, Plan 1437 (Panar and Urguhart).

The Manager recommended that Council authorize the acquisition of the above described easement, which is required in connection with Phase 3 of the South Slope Sewer Project, for a consideration of \$1.00 plus restoration of the easement area.

The Manager also recommended that Council authorize the execution of the necessary documents.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR CLARK, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS:

"That the recommendation of the Manager be adopted."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

(4) Land Reclamation - Central Valley Area.

The Manager reported that advice has been received that the Corporation can obtain approximately 130,000 cubic yards of surplus surcharge material from the preloading of the peat areas of the Trans-Canada Highway for a price of \$1.00 per cubic yard. He advised that some CO,000 cubic yards of this material is in the vicinity of Willingdon Avenue and the Freeway while the remaining 50,000 cubic yards is in the area of Sprott Street and the Freeway. The Manager added that it is proposed to place this material on Municipal land near the Freeway, the cost of which to be borne by the Department of Highways with the Corporation clearing its property prior to the placing of the material.

The Manager opinionated that this proposal appears to produce a relatively inexpensive method of improving and reclaiming some Municipal land which, if so improved, would have a reasonably high potential value.

He further reported that there is a site approximately 10 acres in size on the east side of Willingdon Avenue adjoining the Freeway and also a site approximately 11 acres in size in the Sprott - Sperling area which could be suitable for the use contemplated. The Manager supplied details of these two areas, such as their present zoning, the proposed future use of them, and the characteristics of the sites themselves.

He pointed out that while the cost of these proposed reclamation projects would be confined to clearing, there is also the matter of land acquisition to be considered; the purpose of which would be:

- (a) To facilitate the future widening of Willingdon Avenue;
- (b) To provide comprehensive areas all under Municipal ownership and control;
- (c) To facilitate filling which could be complicated by the necessity to av d any interference with private property and thus eliminate possible claims for trespass or injurious affection.

The Manager further advised that the estimated cost of the suggested acquisitions is \$42,480.00 while the estimated cost of a "package deal" by Fenco to clear the land and place the fill material would be \$15,500.00.

He pointed out that for an estimated expenditure of approximately \$50,000.00, the Corporation would have the opportunity of consolidating two large areas for future commercial or industrial use and obtaining material to place these sites in a more usable condition.

The Manager further reported that the Municipal Act would permit the Corporation to enter into a project of this kind and, subject to the approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs, to also appropriate tax sale funds for the acquisition of land and expenses of developing the property.

The Manager concluded by offering the view that the Corporation is being presented with an excellent opportunity to reclaim some potentially valuable land at a bargain price. He added that the fill material will be available around April 1, 1962.

A question was raised as to whether steps could be taken to improve the condition of Sperling Avenue between Grandview-Douglas Highway and Lougheed Highway. It was suggested that rather than merely patch the road, it be completely resurfaced in those places where such treatment is necessary.

The Municipal Engineer was asked to determine whether it is possible to improve the condition of the subject portion of Sperling Avenue along the lines suggested. Some discussion took place concerning the recent closing of that portion of Hastings Street in the vicinity of Delta Avenue and the consequent need to detour traffic via Gamma Avenue, Frances Street, and Springer Avenue. It was mentioned that there was some uncertainty as to whose responsibility it was to maintain the detour route; the uncertainty being between the Department of Highways and the contractor widening the subject portion of Hastings Street.

It was reported to Council that the condition of the detour route recently became quite deplorable and, because of the situation mentioned regarding responsibility for maintenance, Municipal work forces were deployed to improve the roads comprising the detour route.

The view was expressed by Council that the Corporation should know in advance, whenever road construction is being undertaken on Arterial Highways, what the policy will be with respect to the maintenance of detour routes.
