FEBRUARY 1, 1965

An adjourned meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, Municipal Hall, 45.65 East Grandview-Douglas Highway, on Monday, February 1, 19.55, at 7:30 p.m.

PRESENT:

Roeve Emmott in the Chair; Councillors Blair, Cafferky, Corsbie, Dailly, Drummond, Edwards, Herd and Hicks

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR CAFFERKY: "That all of the below listed correspondence be received."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Secretary, Burnaby Citizen's Committee for Access to Burnard Inlet at Barnet Park, wrote requesting that Council Instruct the Parks and Recreation Commission to withhold a decision on the feasibility of any type of crossing of the C.P.R. tracks in the area of Barnet Park until the Committee has presented plans for the development of the Park as a Centennial project.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HERD, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR CAFFERKY:
"That the letter from the Committee be referred to the Parks and Recreation Commission for attention."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Chairman, Lower Mainland Regional Planning Board, wrote forwarding a submission containing the proposed programme and budget for the Board for the current year.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR CAFFERKY:
"That the submission from the Lower Mainland Regional Planning Board be tabled for a period of one week in order to allow each member of Council an opportunity to examine the proposals in the presentation."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

ilominating Chairman, Burnaby Community Chest Council, submitted a letter advising that the Community Chest Council would be pleased to have a Council representative as a Director of the Burnaby Community Chest Council.

His Worship, Reeve Λ . H. Emmott, recommended that Councillor Drummond be appointed to the position mentioned by the Burnaby Community Chest Council.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR CORSBIE: "That the recommendation of the Reeve be adopted."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

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Secretary-Treasurer, Burnaby School Board, submitted a letter advising that, after careful consideration of the proposal advanced by Else Enterprizes Limited for the operation of a discotheque club in the Municipality, the Board resolved to not support the proposal.

Assistant District Superintendent of Schools, Victoria School Board, wrote advising that there has been no problem in the Victoria area as a result of the establishment of a discotheque club there.

Municipal Manager reviewed the report he had submitted to Council on January 18th dealing with the application of Else Enterprizes Limited, particularly that part containing the views of the R.C.M.P., for the enlightenment of all present.

It was announced that Mr. Else was in attendance and perhaps would desire an audience.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS, SECCHDED BY COUNCILLOR DAILLY: "That Mr. Else be heard."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Mr. Else then spoke and advised that he had attended the meeting of the School Board when his application received attention and he had understood there were two objections, they being that the Board felt the Club should have a man and wife as chaperones and the other being the proposed hours of operation.

Mr. Else explained why he felt the presence of a man and wife as chaperones would not achieve the end apparently desired by the School Board.

He also mentioned that the Club could amend its proposed hours of operation. In this regard, Mr. Else stated that the following were the hours that the Club proposes to operate:

(a) Monday to Thursday Inclusive - 7:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. (b) Friday - 3:30 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. (c) Saturday - 1:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. (d) Sunday - 1:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.

As regards the Provincial Fire Regulations, Mr. Else stated that the Provincial Fire Marshal would allow a density of one person per 15 square feet, which would allow for a maximum of 147, but the Club plans on only allowing about 100 in the building at any one time.

With respect to the role of the Police, Mr. Else advised that his Club would endeavour to maintain control while the attendees were in the building but, naturally, if it became necessary to eject anyone, the conduct of such persons would then become the concern of the Police Force.

He stressed that most of the attendees after 10:00 p.m. are not students and that the time between 3:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. is not a popular one for students because of their after-school activities.

Mr. Else concluded by advising that it is planned to spend approximately \$5,100.00 renovating the building and to also enter into a three-year lease for the premises.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR DAILLY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR HEAD: "That, pursuant to "Burnaby Town Planning By-Law 1940", permission be granted to Else Enterprizes Limited to use the property known as 4240 Hastings Street for the purpose of operating a discotheque club there, on the following conditions:

(1) That the hours of operation be:

(a) Monday to Thursday inclusive - 7:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. (b) Friday - 3:30 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. (c) Saturday - 1:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. (d) Sunday - 1:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.

(2) That all fire and health regulations pertaining to the use of the building in question be satisfied."

CARRIED

COUNCILLORS CAFFERKY & DRUMMOND - AGAINST

Mrs. Vivien Scoble submitted a letter lodging a complaint concerning the polluting of air in North Burnaby by the Shell Oil Company on January 27, 1965.

In response to an enquiry, Councillor Hicks stated that the Health Department had visited the area in question on the date mentioned and had ascertained the cause of the problem that was occurring.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR:
"That the complaint from Mrs. Scoble be referred to the Air
Pollution Control Committee for attention and further, that
the Committee examine the question of determining the cost to
be expected in engaging the B.C. Research Council to offer
an opinion on the efficiency of the methods employed by the
cil companies in these phases of their operations that result
in the emission of fumes to the air and, if it is felt the
Research Council should be retained, it be asked to ascertain
the degree to which the operations of the cil companies can
be measured and controlled."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR DRUMMOND: "That a copy of the letter from Mrs. Scoble be forwarded to the oil companies operating refineries in this Municipality for their attention."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Secretary-Treasurer, Burnaby School Board, submitted the Annual Budget of the Board for the current year and suggested that Council meet with the Board to discuss the Budget.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR CORSBIE: "That the invitation to meet with the Board be accepted and arrangements be made to hold the meeting at a time that is mutually acceptable to both the Board and the Council."

Advisory Planning Commission submitted a report recommending that a member of the Planning Department also be authorized to attend the Joint Planning Conference of the Community Planning Association of Canada and American Society of Planning Officials.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS: "That the recommendation of the Commission be adopted and the Planning Director, Mr. Λ . L. Parr, be authorized to attend the Conference In question."
