### MARCH 1, 1965

An adjourned meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, Municipal Hall, 4545 East Grandview-Douglas Highway, on Monday, March 1, 1965, at 7:30 p.m.

PRESENT:

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR CAFFERKY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR:
"That the minutes of the meetings held February 8 and 15, 1965
be adopted as written and confirmed."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

The following wrote requesting an audience with Council:

- (1) Mr. A. Celli re the lane allowance between Neville Street and Clinton Street East from Gilley Avenue.
- (2) Mr. E. O'Krane re the same matter.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR HERD: "That the delegations be heard."

### CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

(1) Mr. Celli appeared and stated that he was the spokesman for approximately fifty people in the area East of Gilley Avenue between Neville and Portland Streets who opposed a proposal of the Council to close the lane allowance between Neville and Clinton Streets East from Gilley Avenue to all but pedestrian traffic.

He displayed a sketch of the area involved and pointed out that the subject lane was created in 1952 when the "Eacrett" property was subdivided. He pointed out that this lane is used more extensively than was originally anticipated and, at this time, approximately 80 cars and 100 pedestrians per day use the lane.

He explained that the reason for this rather heavy use was that this lane is the logical route to follow for those travelling from the area East of Gilley Avenue in a North-West direction. He added that the children in the area attend Clinton Street School which involves a movement in a North-Westerly direction. Mr. Celli pointed out that vehicular traffic does not use Portland Street to arrive at Gilley Avenue because this involves travelling in a Southerly direction, which movement is not reasonable when one wishes to travel North-Westerly. He also mentioned that the other alternate route via Hedley Avenue is not preferable because Hedley Avenue at Rumble Street is very steep and motorists try to avoid this route, if possible.

Mr. Celli emphasized that the closing of the lane allowance in question would compel motorists to use either of the two alternative routes just mentioned. He also pointed out that there is no turn-around facility at the Western end of Clinton Street and therefore motorists must travel along the lane at the end of this Street and make their turn.

Mr. Celli advised that those he represented wished the lane in question widened to accommodate both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. He suggested that, if this was not feasible, perhaps another walkway could be provided for the pedestrian traffic.

(2) Mr. E. O'Krane was not present and another gentlemen appeared and indicated he was speaking on behalf of those allude to in the letter from Mr. O'Krane.

This gentlemen questioned the merits of paving the North-South lane between Portland Street and the lane North of Clinton Street, pointing out that this would merely encourage more traffic to use this facility. He drew attention to the fact that the lane is not only narrow but there are view obstructions at different points along its length.

He also advised that the subject lane allowance is heavily used during the summer months by attendees at the baseball games at Prenter Park.

He also suggested that consideration be given the extension of Clinton Street to Gilley Avenue as a means of improving access from this Avenue to the area involved.

The delegation was informed that the matter of concern to it captured the attention of Council on February 22nd when it was felt a cost estimate should be provided for the following before rendering a decision on the question of closing the lane allowance East from Gilley Avenue between Neville Street and Clinton Street to all but pedestrian traffic:

- (a) The construction of a cul-de-sac facility at the Western end of Clinton Street where the North-South lane East of Gilley Avenue meets it.
- (b) The paving of this lane between Portland Street and Clinton Street.
- (c) The paving of the extension of this lane North from Clinton Street.
- (d) The acquisition of an additional 10 feet for the widening of the 10-foot lane allowance East from Gilley Avenue between Clinton and Neville Streets and constructing it.

It was stated that the report containing this information should be furnished to Council on March 8th and, if it is, the By-law relating to the closing of the subject 10-foot lane allowance will be brought forward for further consideration.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR DAILLY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR HERD:
"That all of the below listed correspondence be received."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

<u>Secretary</u>, <u>Buckingham School Parents' Association</u>, submitted a letter advising that the Association is opposed to a proposal to close Buckingham Avenue at Sperling Avenue and that it favours the provision of a gravel chip path on Buckingham Avenue.

The Secretary also mentioned that an earlier request from the Association for street lighting referred to that portion of Buckingham Avenue East of Burris Street to Buckingham School.

She also enquired as to when the traffic control signal is to be installed on Grandview-Douglas Highway at Burris Street.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR CORSBIE, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR:
"That consideration of this item of correspondence be deferred until
Item 8 of the Traffic Safety Committee Report is dealt with later in the
evening."

Chairman, Purple Cross Fund Committee, Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, wrote requesting permission for Lodges 438 and 439 to hold a Tag Day on May 14, 1965 between 5:00 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. and also on May 15, 1965 between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. in the following areas:

- (a) Lodge No. 438 That area of the Municipality South of Lougheed Highway.
- (b) Lodge No. 439 That area North of the said Highway.

<u>Secretary, Women's Committee, Canadian Cystic Fibrosis Foundation,</u> wrote seeking permission to hold a Tag Day on December 18, 1965.

Chairman, Local Sponsoring Committee, Air Cadet League of Canada, Royal Canadian Air Cadets, No. 637 "Arrow" Squadron, submitted a letter requesting permission to hold an Annual Tag Day on the evening of April 30th and all day on May 1, 1965.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR CAFFERKY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR CORSBIE:
"That permission be granted to each of the above three organizations to conduct their campaigns at the times indicated."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

<u>Secretary, District of Coquitlam Chamber of Commerce</u>, wrote conveying the appreciation of the Chamber for the co-operation shown by the Burnaby Fire Department in combatting the fire which occurred at the Burquitlam Shopping Plaza on February 21, 1965.

The Secretary also expressed appreciation to Council for making the co-operation mentioned possible.

"That a copy of the letter from the District of Coquitlam Chamber of

Councillor Cafferky advised that a freight train leaves Vancouver at 8:00 a.m. every day and proceeds East to a junk yard in the vicinity of Willingdon Avenue. He pointed out that this train arrives at its destination at the time Willingdon Avenue is being heavily used by motorists and, because of the train, the crossing protection on Willingdon Avenue at the railway tracks is operative thus preventing motorists from travelling through. He pointed out that the arms of the crossing gate remain down even though the train is actually beyond Willingdon Avenue because the train generally returns shortly after it arrives at the junk yard but some drivers, becoming impatient, travel around the arms.

It was suggested that perhaps the junk company could be asked to only accept the number of cars needed daily so as to not unduly delay the traffic flow on Willingdon Avenue.

Another proposal was that the railway company could be requested to manually raise the arms while the train was not actually crossing Willingdon Avenue.
