NOVEMBER 15, 1965

An adjourned meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, Municipal Hall, 4545 East Grandview-Douglas Highway, Burnaby 2, B.C., at 7:30 p.m.

PRESENT:

Reeve Emmott in the Chair; Councillors Blair, Cafferky, Corsbie, Dailly, Drummond, Edwards, Herd and Hicks

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR CAFFERKY: "That the Minutes of the meeting held October 25, 1965, be adopted as written and confirmed."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Burnaby Lyric Opera wrote asking for permission to appear before Council in connection with the Company's future activities and objectives.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR CAFFERKY: "That the delegation be heard."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Mr. Terrance Wolff appeared and explained that Mrs. L. Fisk and Mr. C. Cox, principals of the Burnaby Lyric Opera, were also present in the Council Chamber.

Mr. Wolff explained that the Burnaby Lyric Opera Company was Canada's newest and poorest opera company. They had been rehearsing for nearly two months without any financial assistance towards the production of an evening of light and grand opera at the new Simon Fraser University Theatre in early 1966.

He went on to explain that he thought the citizens of Burnaby would benefit by the presence of the Company as it would create outlets for musical talents in the community. He stated that there were no outside promoters and no one was being paid for contributing their time, talents or energy.

Mr. Wolff pointed out that he thought that a municipality of the size of Burnaby could afford a small non-professional opera company of the type they had in mind. All the performers would be local residents and it was not their intent to spend money on large orchestras or expensive scenery and hoped to be able to put on first class productions of popular opera without this large expense. He explained that the most pressing requirement at the moment was money to organize the first show; to hire a professional pianist available for rehearsals, to pay for the rental of musical scores, to commit themselves for costume and scenery as well as the cost of ticket and programme printing and the hire of the theatre.

Mr. Wolff concluded by stating that the Federal and Provincial Governments would not support such a company until it was established and proven. He requested a grant on behalf of the Company of \$4,500.00 in order to become established.

Mr. Wolff was questioned about the Company's total budget requirements for the year and asked how large a percentage the requested grant from the municipality would comprize of this budget. He was also asked whether it was their intent to request annual grants. Mr. Wolff explained that he had

not got all the projected financial budgeting information available at the present time although this would be readily supplied to the Council. He explained that \$4,500.00 was more than the cost of the first production and was more a request for a grant to establish the Company than anything else. He thought that the first production would cost in the order of \$1,000.00 and the remainder of the money would give them some slight security for the future. He sincerely hoped that it would not be necessary for the Company to approach the Council for a grant each year as he hoped they would be eligible for grants from other sources, such as the Canada Council, but he could not give a definite assurance that they would not request more assistance from the Council in future.

In answer to further questions, Mr. Wolff explained that the first production was scheduled to run for three days although they hoped it could be longer if funds were available. He pointed out that the Company had already received tentative enquiries to join a Metro operatic organization. The Company hoped to have at least one operatic production a year and more if possible. They had at the moment approximately thirty singers and twelve principals. It was his definite opinion that opera could survive in the community and he looked forward one day to a Lower Mainland operatic society. Nost of the available talent at the moment came from Burnaby but they would not necessarily limit themselves to Burnaby residents.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR CORSBIE, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR DAILLY: "That the request be approved."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

<u>Vancouver Art Gallery</u> submitted a letter thanking the Council for the grant of \$200.00 to the Art Gallery.

B.C. Hydro and Power Authority submitted a letter dated November 5, 1965, concerning the proposed redevelopment of Stride Avenue gravel pit, copy of which is attached to and forms a part of these Minutes.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR CORSBIE, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS:
"That the letter be referred to the Manager for consideration and report
by the various Municipal Departments involved."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

A question was raised at the meeting concerning the suggested exchange of land mentioned in the letter. It was understood that, when consideration was given by the staff to the proposal, the fact that the site of the rail right-of-way at Burnaby Lake was conveyed without monetary consideration to the B.C. Electric Railway Company, would be borne in mind.

Lower Mainland Regional Planning Board submitted a notice of a General Board meeting to be held on November 18th at 8:00 p.m. In Chilliwhack to discuss, inter alia, the official Regional Plan.

It was pointed out that November 18th was also the date of the special meeting between the Parks Board and the Council at 5:30 p.m. but Councillor Hicks, the Council's representative on the Board, Indicated that he intended to be present at both meetings.

National Energy Board submitted a copy of a public notice with respect to an application pursuant to Section 49 of the National Energy Board Act by Trans Mountain Oil Pipe Line Company relative to the construction of refrigerated tankage capacity at Burnaby, B.C.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR CAFFERKY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR:
"That the letter be referred to the Municipal Solicitor with the
direction that the National Energy Board be informed of the Council's
concurrence with the proposal."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR CAFFERKY:
"That the Council now resolve itself into Committee of the Whole." (3:15 p.m.)

The following matters were then lifted from the table:

(a) Royal Commission on Transit

The Committee had before them for consideration the motion introduced by Councillor Hicks at the Council meeting of November 1, 1965, (see Minute Book Page No. 275), which was tabled for seven days at that meeting and tabled for a further seven days at the meeting held on November 9th, This motion was dealt with as follows:

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR DAILLY: "That:

WHEREAS the problems of transportation especially as they pertain to high density urban areas in B.C. are growing and becoming less soluble;

WHEREAS transit as a factor in transportation may be the only solution to the traffic strangulation that creates tremendous expenditure for traffic arteries and traffic controls in metro areas:

WHEREAS municipal planning is dependent on some foreknowledge or control of transit;

AND WHEREAS the present situation in regard to the expiration of franchise agreements in 1966 is charged with concern as to the ownership of transit and responsibility for transit's losses, thus creating an atmosphere of tension and rejection of a more active part in transit activities by the civic bodies because of financial expediency; justifiable as this may be, the end result may not be in the best interest of this province or its metro areas;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Municipality of Burnaby and the Joint Committee of Mayors and Reeves of Greater Vancouver and Victoria request a Royal Commission to study the value and potential of transit, the present subsidies on transit, and where the responsi-

bility for these subsidies should fall, as well as making an assessment as to the value of metro control of and organization of a transit system such as that practised in the Toronto Metro Area, with a view to making recommendations to the Province of B.C. and its Crown Corporation, the B.C.H.A., as well as civic bodies who have a concern for transit."

WHEREAS The Corporation of the District of Burnaby has examined in detail an area of approximately 39 acres within the North-West district of the municipality, more particularly bounded by Boundary Road to the West, the lane North of and parallel to Albert Street to the North, MacDonald Avenue to the East, and the lane South of and parallel to Pender Street to the South;

AND WHEREAS The Corporation of the District of Burnaby has prepared an Urban Renewal Scheme for an area of approximately 3.2 acres bounded by Esmond Avenue, Hastings Street, MacDonald Avenue and Pender Street;

AND WHEREAS this scheme has been prepared in accordance with an agreement dated the 19th March, 1965 entered into between the Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation and The Corporation of the District of Burnaby pursuant to Section 23A of the National Housing Act, 1954;

NOW THEREFORE the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby resolves:

That the Urban Renewal Scheme be approved and forwarded to the Provincial and Federal Governments, together with a request that financial assistance be provided by the Provincial and Federal Governments in order to implement the Urban Renewal Scheme, being the acquisition of land, demolition of buildings and preparation of site within an area of approximately 3.2 acres bounded by Esmond Avenue, Hastings Street, MacDonald Avenue and Pender Street at an estimated total cost of \$1,016,279.00."

Councillor Cafferky requested consideration of a grant to a Burnaby student travelling to the United Nations, the expenses for which would amount to \$300.00. Councillor Cafferky undertook to bring a letter in this regard for consideration of the Grants Committee.
