# OCTOBER 4, 1965

An adjourned meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, Municipal Hall, 4545 East Grandview-Douglas Highway, Burnaby 2, B.C., on Monday, October 4, 1965, at 7:30 p.m.

PRESENT:

Reeve Emmott in the Chair; Councillors Blair (8:20 p.m.), Corsbie (7:35 p.m.), Dailly, Drummond, Edwards, Herd and Hicks

ABSENT:

Councillor Cafferky

The Minutes of the meeting held September 13, 1965, came forward for adoption.

Councillor Hicks pointed out that he was shown on the second page of the September 13th Minutes as being opposed to one of the resolutions. He stated that he had not been at the meeting and therefore could not have registered the negative vote credited to him.

The Municipal Clerk suggested that it was probably Councillor Herd who had been opposed to the motion in question and that this correction would be made.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR DAILLY:
"That the Minutes of the meeting held September 13, 1965, be amended by deleting the name of Councillor Hicks from the negative vote shown against the resolution on Page 174 and entering Councillor Herd as being opposed to that resolution, and the Minutes, as just amended, be adopted."

### CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Secretary, Buckingham School Association, wrote requesting an opportunity to address Council on the matter of the Municipality providing a cinder or gravel chip pathway on Sperling Avenue and on Burris Street.

Mrs. N. F. Burkell wrote requesting an opportunity to address Council in regard to the matter of the Municipality providing an access road to that part of Twelfth Avenue North of Marine Drive.

Mr. Walter Evans also wrote and made the same request as Mrs. Burkell.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HERD, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR DAILLY: "That the delegations be heard."

# CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

COUNCILLOR CORSBIE ARRIVED AT THE MEETING.

Mr. Burkell first appeared and explained that, because of the inadequate access situation confronting those on Twelfth Avenue North of Marine Drive, it was difficult for deliveries to be made and there is always a potential danger of emergency vehicles not being able to respond when required to serve the people on the street.

#### He requested that:

- (a) an access road to Twelfth Avenue North of Marine Drive,
- (b) a lane to serve those properties on the East side of the subject portion of Twelfth Avenue,

be provided.

Mr. Burkell mentioned that it was not felt a lane was required for those on the West side of the street because their lots are of such a width that secondary access can effectively be had.

Municipal Engineer reported verbally on the position being taken by his Department in respect of the requests, in this regard stating that there is no ready solution to the problem of providing the access desired by the property owners concerned. He added that the area involved is to be the subject of a replot and this, it is expected, might resolve the problem.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HERD, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR DRUMMOND:
'That the request of the delegation be tabled for two weeks and information
be supplied then by the Manager indicating:

- (i) the cost involved in acceding to the requests for the road and lane mentioned by the delegation;
- (ii) the future land use situation for the area involved."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

<u>Dr. H. Ellis</u> appeared on behalf of the Buckingham School Parent-Teachers Association and urged that Council provide an interim walking facility on Buckingham Avenue from Sperling Avenue to Burris Street and on Burris Street from Grandview-Douglas Highway Southward. Dr. Ellis suggested that the type of facility be an 18-inch wide gravel footpath.

He made reference to past representations which have been made to Council by the Buckingham School Parent-Teachers Association for measures of the kind such as those now being requested and emphasized that the people involved feel such facilities are required because:

- (a) the speed and volume of traffic on the two streets is such that it is hazardous for pedestrians, especially school children;
- (b) visibility is poor due to the curves on the roads and the frequent presence of fog in the area;
- (c) space on the sides of the present roadway is limited and is not conducive to safe walking practices;
- (d) there have been a number of accidents on the streets;
- (e) not only has there been an increase in the volume of traffic but there are more large trucks using the streets than before.

Dr. Ellis suggested that the installation of a traffic light on Grandview-Douglas Highway at Burris Street would not significantly relieve the traffic volume situation.

He also suggested that the type of treatment being proposed by the Association would obviate the need to move the ornamental trees on the subject portion of Buckingham Avenue.

When an enquiry was made as to the reaction of the people involved to a proposal to cul-de-sac Buckingham Avenue, Dr. Ellis stated that those concerned were opposed to the proposal.

During discussion, it was felt by Council that a walking facility such as that proposed by Dr. Ellis would be economically imprudent because the cost of it compared to a concrete sidewalk is almost as much. Moreover, it was of the view that a gravel footpath has a very limited lifetime compared to a concrete walk and is not as palatable for those using the facility.

Municipal Engineer suggested that the construction of a 4-foot wide concrete sidewalk could be undertaken on an alignment that would in no way interfere with the ornamental trees on the boulevard of Buckingham Avenue.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR DRUMMOND, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS:
"That the construction of a 4-foot wide concrete sidewalk on the
North side of Buckingham Avenue between Sperling Avenue and Burris
Street be initiated as a Local Improvement, on the understanding that
this project will be undertaken on an alignment that will not interfere
with the ornamental trees on the boulevard of the street."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR DRUMMOND, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS:

"That, because it is felt the portion of Burris Street in question
should receive similar treatment insofar as a sidewalk is concerned,
the Municipal Engineer submit a report indicating:

- (a) the length of the work that is considered desirable;
- (b) the extent and cost of it;

so that Council can determine the course of action that should be taken on the  $proposal_{\bullet}^{II}$ 

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR CORSBIE, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS: "That all of the below listed correspondence be received."

Division Manager, Transportation, B.C. Hydro and Power Authority, wrote advising that the Authority had established a trial bus service between the Edmonds Loop and the Simon Fraser University on Saturdays and Sundays which will also serve the central part of the Municipality where the C. G. Brown Memorial Swimming Pool and the Participation Ice Rink are located.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR DRUMMOND:
"That the sincere appreciation of Council be conveyed to the B.C.
Hydro and Power Authority for instituting the service described in its letter."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

It was felt by Council that it would be beneficial if the travel times of the buses passing the Swimming Pool and Ice Rink area were posted in the two buildings.

It was understood that the B.C. Hydro and Power Authority would be requested to furnish copies of the pertinent bus schedules so that arrangements could be made to post them in conspicuous positions in both the Swimming Pool and Ice Rink buildings.

It was suggested that the Parks and Recreation Commission should investigate the possibility of providing a footpath between Burnaby Mountain Park and Simon Fraser University.

It was directed that an enquiry be made of the Commission to determine its intentions in this regard.

COUNCILLOR BLAIR ARRIVED AT THE MEETING.

Mr. and Mrs. H. F. Salisbury submitted a letter expressing an interest in acquiring Lot 10, Block 20, D.L.  $74N_2^1$ , Plan 2603, by means of public auction.

Municipal Manager stated that he was endeavouring to obtain a legal opinion on the question of selling Municipal property by public auction.

"That the request of Mr. and Mrs. Salisbury be tabled for a period of
