## REMARKS:

Final 1969 Fire Department activity figures compared with those of 1968 reflect that although the number of fires with property damage in excess of \$5.00 were down by nine, damage to property 1969 tripled, primarily due to several arson fires and putting fire losses over the \$1,000,000. mark for the first time.

The total number of alarms of all types increased by 258 making 1969 the busiest year in the Department's history.
