MONTHLY REPORT

Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report for this Department for the month of October 1970.

This month the dental clinics in the south, situated in Edmonds and Windsor schools, surveyed all the kindergarten children in the board schools, private kindergartens, playschools and day care facilities. The dental clinic situated in the Capitol Hill School surveyed all Grade I children in the North Burnaby area. Later on, all the children in the kindergarten grades will also be surveyed in the North Burnaby area. The programme carried out by the dental clinics for these children in their early years is a preventive programme and the Health Department still endorses the fluoridation of the Municipal water supply as the ideal method of prevention.

It was found necessary to move the prenatal classes from the vancouver Heights to the Ellesmere United Church. These new facilities not only provide more space but are in a more central location where they are closer to the homes where the expectant parents reside. The prenatal classes are so popular now that we have reached the point where further expansion in the near future must be considered.

During the month two large clinics were held at the Health Unit for the administration of the Rubella vaccine to those children who, through illness or other reasons, had missed the mass immunization clinics held during September. The figures have now been tabulated for the Rubella Programme. They show that there was a 95% acceptance rate in the school age children while in the preschool age group there was approximately 51% acceptance. It is planned to continue the Rubella Programme through the Child Health Centres during this year in order to reach all the children possible between the ages of 1 and 5.

During the month 39 .ses of communicable diseases were reported. Of these ... there were 18 mumps, 6 infectious hepatitis, 3 each chickenpox, rubella, and tuberculosis, 2 impetigo, and 1 each scabies, pediculosis, salmonellosis and meningitis.
