Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report for this Department for the month of April 1970.

Parents and social workers requesting subsidized camping experience for children under their supervision, have been referred to the Public Health Murses who are now screening and visiting the many children who are eligible to go to one of the summer camps in British Columbia. Last year the Department referred 133 children. It is expected this number will increase this year due to the many labour and financial difficulties.

The administration of the measles vaccine is being extended to school children in accordance with the availability of the vaccine. A special clinic has been set up for this purpose at the Municipal Hall and appointments for this clinic are received by the Department. A large percentage of the preschool and school children have already been protected by either having had the disease or by previous vaccination,

The Health Department is assisting the Meals on Wheels Committee with their plans to extend the program to the North Burnaby area. When this plan is completed the entire Municipality will be covered by this very worthwhile program to bring meals to the elderly and handicapped citizens.

The first Family Planning clinic was held in the Burnaby Health Department under the auspices of the Family Planning Association of B.C. and the Burnaby United Community Services on Tuesday, April 21, 1970 at 7:30 pm. Appointments for this clinic can be obtained by phoning the Health Department appointment desk.

Mrs. Wilma Randi was appointed to the staff April 1, 1970 replacing Miss Nancy Copithorne. Mrs. Randi is a graduate of the University of Saskatchewan and has had experience in the field in that province.

The Communicable Diseases are gradually declining with 191 cases reported. Of these there were 60 chickenpox, 51 measles, 32 mumps, 15 rubella, 9 infectious hepatitis, 6 tuberculosis, 5 pediculosis, 4 each salmonellosis and scarlet fever, 3 whooping cough and 2 impetigo.
