Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report for this Department for the month of July 1970.

To date, 205 children have been screened and referred to various camps in the lower mainland. All the children referred were children who would benefit from camping experience due to some economic, social or emotional problem in their home. This is the largest number that have ever been referred to camp and it was made possible by the generosity of various community and church organizations who contributed funds and camperships for this purpose. Camping experience for children is a very valuable experience as it gives them the opportunity of positive leadership and recreational activity and relating closely with other children of the same age-group.

A family life education committee has been formed with representatives from United Community Services, Health Department, Burnaby Mental Health Centre, and other interested citizens. A course for marriage preparation is being held this month and consists of six  $2-\frac{1}{2}$  hour sessions, each Thursday evening at the British Columbia Institute of Technology. The course is free of charge and is open to couples considering marriage, professional workers are invited to attend.

Mrs. Eraine Jansson was appointed to the position of Speech Therapist this month. Mrs. Jansson has been assigned to the North Burnaby area while Mrs. Wilma Haig, the present Speech Therapist, will continue her work in the South Burnaby area and in the two Hard of Hearing classes.

One of the students enrolled in the Public Health Inspectors: course at the British Columbia Institute of Technology has a three-month summer placement with the Public Health Inspectors of this Department. Under close supervision he will perform some of the duties of the regular inspectors.

The incidence of communicable diseases reported during the month remains at the usual seasonal low with 39 cases reported. There were 16 salmonellosis, 10 infectious hepatitis, 6 rubella, 3 whooping cough, 2 tuberculosis and 1 each scarlet fever and ringworm.
