MONTHLY REPORT

Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report of this Department for the month of June 1970.

A recent time analysis study of the various Public Health Mursing services carried out in the Department has now been computed. The percentage distribution of the nurses' time shows that a total of 49.9% is spent in the school program, 13.2% of the time is spent in the infant and preschool program. The prenatal program took 2.4% of the time, 1.2% in unit immunization clinics, .7% spent on the student program and .6% in hospital liaison. 12.8% of the time was spent on home visits for all programs and 4.6% of the time was spent in travel. The balance of the time was spent in liaison work with other agencies and community workers, correspondence, meetings, recording and reports.

"The Meals on Wheels" program has now completed its second year of operation in the South Burnaby area. June 1st this year saw the commencement of the program in North Burnaby, so the Municipality is now completely covered by this very worthwhile service. The Health Department has been active in this program since its earliest planning stages and screens all recipients that are not known to the Victorian Order of Nurses. The majority of these people are elderly and are suffering general debility and conditions associated with old age. Between 40 and 50 people are receiving this service at the present time.

Mrs. Patricia Kaatz resigned this month and is now in Europe.

Mrs. Henrietta Holmes is filling this position on a temporary basis until

August 1st when a new appointment will be made.

There were 162 cases of communicable diseases reported during the month.

Of these there were 59 chickenpox, 45 measles, 22 mumps, 21 rubella, 8 salmonellosis, 3 tuberculosis, 2 infectious hepatitis, and 1 each whooping cough
and impetigo.
