#### MONTHLY REPORT

Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report for this Department for the month of May 1970.

As more and more people are travelling, the demand is ever increasing for the administration of various immunizations and vaccinations. To better serve these travellers, it has been necessary to temporarily hold two more immunization clinics in addition to the two regular clinics which are conducted weekly in the Health Department and to which these people are referred, on an appointment basis. These clinics offer a wide variety of immunizations which include smallpox, diptheria, tetanus, poliomyelitis, typhoid, paratyphoid, cholera, typhus. The Health Department also completes the International Certificate of Vaccination and Immunization to fulfil the recommended requirements of the World Health Organization for persons travelling to foreign lands.

The Lyndhurst Child Health Centre has now been moved to a new location in the Cameron Road School. The clinic hours have been changed so that the clinic commences at 11:00 a.m. and continues throughout the afternoon. This move will bring these facilities closer to the centre of the population in that area and to the Lougheed Mall.

The four Students enrolled in the School of Nursing at the University of British Columbia completed their 8-month field experience with this Department. Also throughout the year groups of Nursing Students from the British Columbia Institute of Technology have spent their field work in the Burnaby Child Health Centres and Prenatal Classes.

Many of the staff attended the Annual Meeting of the B.C. Branch, Canadian Public Health Association held this month at the University of British Columbia. Two members of the staff were re-elected to the Executive of the Branch, Miss Doreen Leslie as Secretary and Mrs. April Olson as Executive-at-Large. Also Miss Leslie was a delegate to the National Meeting held in Winnipeg May 19-22.

There were 215 cases of communicable diseases reported during the month which was a slight increase over the previous month. There were 65 measles, 53 chickenpox, 38 mumps, 30 rubella, 19 salmonellosis, 4 impetigo, 2 infectious hepatitis, and 1 each tuberculosis, whooping cough, scarlet fever and ringworm.
