MONTHLY REPORT

Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report for this Department for the month of February 1970.

In a statistical review of the cancer deaths in Burnaby during 1969, the report shows there were a total of 178 cancer deaths during the year. The breakdown as to site, is as follows—36 lung, 23 bowel, 19 pancreas, 17 stomach, 13 breast, 9 bladder, 7 rectum, 6 prostate, 5 each uterus and ovaries, 4 leukaemia, 3 cervix and 31 other sites. A further breakdown by age group showed that there were 2 in the 5-14 year group, 3 in 15-24 year, 12 in 25-44 year, 55 in 45-64 year, 91 in 65-84 year, and 15 in the 85 years and over group.

The demand is ever increasing for the administration of various immunizations and vaccinations for people who are travelling. An additional clinic on Monday mornings has been commenced to bring to three the immunization clinics conducted by the Health Department to which these people are referred on an appointment basis. To fulfill the recommended requirements of the World Health Organization, a wide variety of immunizations are offered. These include smallpox, diptheria, tetanus, policmyelitis, typhoid, paratyphoid, cholera, and typhus. The International Certificate of Vaccinations and Immunizations is completed by the Department to fulfill a requirement for persons travelling to foreign lands.

Starting this month one of the nurses visits the Burnaby General Hospital Obstetrical Department in a liaisen capacity. The purpose of this visiting is to obtain earlier and appropriate referrals for home visiting upon discharge from hospital. The hospital liaisen also assisted in coordination between the prenatal teaching program conducted by the Health Department and the Obstetrical Department in the hespital.

Although the reported communicable diseases were lower this month, they still remain at a very high level with 405 cases reported. Of these there were 178 measles, 141 chickenpox, 67 mumps, 4 each salmonellosis and tuberculosis, 2 each infectious hepatitis, rubella, conjunctivitis and scabies, and 1 each whooping cough, scarlet fever and impetigo.
