REMARKS:

January 29, 1970, Equipment responded to a 3 alarm fire in an apartment at 6675 Dow Avenue. Twenty off-duty personnel were called to assist in fighting the fire. Smoke was of such density that 58 bottles of compressed air were required to enable the fire-fighters to bring the fire under control. The fire was believed to have been caused by sparks and fly ash from a garbage chute fire falling down between the wall studding around an improperly fitting duct at the first floor garbage chute door. Loss is estimated at ~ 96,500.
