RE: SENIOR CITIZENS' ACCOMMODATION
FP2 and FP3

At a meeting of the B. C. Housing Management Commission held on the 9th of October, 1970, I was asked by the Chairman, Mr. Edward Brown, to obtain from the Municipal Council, a decision on the condition of residency in the Municipality as a requisite for eligibility in application for accommodation.

This has been discussed with the members of the Burnaby Housing Committee, as a result of which the following conditions of residency are recommended to Council for their consideration:-

1. Applicants now residing in Burnaby

Shall have been a resident of the Municipality for a minimum of twelve months immediately preceding the application.


2. Applicants not now residing in Burnaby

Shall have been a resident of the Municipality for a minimum of five years during the fifteen year period, immediately preceding the application.

Condition No. 1 is a usual requirement with all Federal Provincial housing projects.

Condition No. 2 is intended to allow those people who have lived in the Municipality for a reasonable period of time since the age of forty (and have subsequently moved) to make an application. The five year period is necessary to ensure that the applicant is a bona fide resident and the fifteen year period is necessary to ensure that five years spent in Burnaby in their youth will not make a person eligible for Senior Citizens' accommodation.
