Re: PLANNING DEPARTMENT PROGRAM OF REQUIRED REPORTS, PROJECTS AND STUDIES.

Following consideration of the above Program, which was initially prepared in consultation with Alderman Ladner, Council, on September 10, 1970, gave its approval to proposed priority designations and directed this department to submit an updated report by January 31, 1971, including an estimate of the time required to complete the various items in the Program.

The attached updated Program provides a list of studies and reports which have been assigned to this department with an indication of the current status of each and the estimated time required for completion in man days. The priorities shown are those which were approved by the Council on September 10, 1970. Work which has been requested since that time, has not been given a priority, with the exception of those projects where specific scheduling has been established by Council.

It is considered that all of the work included in the program is required and has a high priority. The designations A, B and C have been assigned as a means of scheduling the order of the projects and studies to be undertaken. The list does not include the day to day work of the department such as rezoning, subdivision, development control, preliminary plan approval applications, consultations with public and developers, meetings with other Boards, Commissions, Committees etc., or other miscellaneous work, including that which is required for the weekly Council meetings. These items, in themselves, involve a considerable amount of work, as indicated by the estimated 35% of total staff time which is actually available for those items included in the Work Program.

In order to put the Program into perspective, a summary of the priorities and the estimated time required to be devoted to each category is also attached. In comparing the total man days required for the various projects and studies with the man days available from the existing staff on an annual basis, it is concluded that a period of 2 1/2 years will be needed to complete those items listed. This work, of course, could not be completed within 2 1/2 years since additional requests are continually being made for new reports, projects and studies.

We would request that Council review the existing priorities and provide approved priorities for those items for which priorities have not yet been established. Once this has been done we will be in a position to finalize a Program with appropriate starting dates for the individual items.
