#### 8. Re: Medical Health Monthly Report.

Following for your information is the report of the Medical Health Officer covering the activities of his Department for the month of September, 1971.

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#### MONTHLY REPORT

Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report of this Department for the month of September 1971.

The total enrolment in the board schools this September is 28,712 and in the non-board 1,965 making a grand total of 30,677 pupils. The school health services are offered to children in both board and non-board schools. It was the policy of the School Board, two years ago, to include kindergartens in a number of schools, this policy has continued and there are now 32 schools offering a kindergarten programme to 1,645 children. The school health service arranges a full health assessment for all children in the kindergarten age group and also to grade 1 children who are entering school for the first time and have not previously been examined by the school medical health officers. The findings of these health examinations are shared with the teachers by a public health nurse so the children can be assisted to their fullest extent in the school situation.

The rubella vaccination programme which commenced last year with the mass immunization clinic throughout the Municipality is being maintained from pre-school years through and including grade 1. In addition, notices were sent to all grade 10 girls urging them to consult their family physicians with regard to receiving the rubella vaccine. The vaccination programme for the red measles which commenced in August, 1969 is also being maintained, with vaccine offered to the same age group. Measles is still considered a very serious threat to young children.

Due to renovations in the Lochdale school, it has been necessary to move the Child Health Centre to the St. Margaret's Church Hall on Sperling at Curtis. This move has proved to be more convenient to the mothers attending this clinic.

There was an increase in the reported communicable diseases over the same period last year and last month with a total 35 cases reported. Of these there were 14 mumps, 5 impetigo, 4 each salmonellosis and infectious hepatitis, 3 scables, 2 chickenpox and 1 new tuberculosis.
