

It is difficult to comment on these statistics bearing in mind the current economic condition here, as elsewhere, and bearing in mind the terms of the various "Welfare" acts governing our actions (Reference my report to Council of Oct.2,1970).

The out of Province cases are not inordinately high, when we consider they are spread over 9 provinces, but again when looked at in conjunction with the all over welfare costs, one may feel any increase is not palatable, no matter the origin of the applicant.

I can only add we are doing our best to be humane and meet only basic needs and can only hope for an upward economic swing which alone will eradicate the major part of our socio-economic problem.

A constant review of the out of Province cases will be periodically submitted.
