4. Re: Miscellancous Semi-Capital Type Drainage Works And Letter of Complaint - Mr. P.C. Pelchat, 8053 - 16th Avenue.

The Engineer advises that during the recent two flooding conditions encountered in Burnaby, we had a number of problems come to light through the heavy and rapid run-off of water. There are some projects which the Engineer describes as semi-maintenance and semi-capital types of work which should be carried out to provide some easing of situations where problems were encountered as we may expect a repeat of these problems in the future during each heavy rain.

More particularly, the situations brought to light over the past two storms were:

1. Easement at 8050 - 17th Avenue -- this easement was piped many, many years ago with a wooden box culvert and has, by large, proved adequate over the years but obviously is now causing us problems. The estimated cost of replacement is . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . $\$ 2,000$
2. Install pipe across Thorne at Meadow Ave. -- Est. cost . $\$ 3,000$.
3. Install pipe across Trapp Rd. at Fraser River Dyke- " \$5,000.
4. Pipe small watercourse at Royal Dak and Byrne Rd. - " $\$ 3,000$.
5. Place rip rap in watercourse easement at 8033 Winston Street . . . . . . . . . . . . . . "

These are not truly major capital works but are nevertheless expensive items and it is not within our ability to charge these to our general drainage account in the Roads Operating Budget without causing a serious over-expenditure.

Appearing on the Agenda as a communication for the November 15 meeting is a letter dated November 3, 1971, from Mr. Pelchat, 8053-16th Avenue complaining of a drainage problem. The problem he refers to will be resolved if project No. 1 noted above is constructed. In this connection, attached you will find the Engineer's reply to Mr. Pelchat dated November 9, 1971, the contents of which are self-explanatory.

Unfortunately, each of these five projects are such that were brought to light only by the two excessively heavy storms, and without the occurrence of these storms, the existing facilities probably would have sufficed without serious problem for a considerable length of time; however, it is not considered prudent to allow present matters to go as they are without rectification.

## RECOMMENDATION:

THAT authority be given to do the work recommended by the Engincer; and
THAT the work be charged against the Special Drainage Projects Account in the Capital Budget; and
THAT \$14,000 be transferred from the Special Roads Projects
Contingency Account in the Capital Budget to the Special Drainage
Projects Account: and
THAT Mr. Pelchat be advised that the necessary work has been authorized.
