

REMARKS: An adult and a juvenile were arrested and charged with the holdup of Sali-King Gulf Service Station in Burnaby on November 17th. They were also involved in four other armed robberies and the theft of at least one auto. Two adults were arrested for the armed robbery of the Pay & Save Service Station at 6th and 13th on November 14, 1971. They were also charged with the theft of an auto. One charge of attempted murder has been laid and a Warrant has been issued for the arrest of the culprit in connection with the shooting of a Burnaby man in North Burnaby on November 30, 1971. Two parolees were arrested on suspicion of armed robberies and have been charged with theft from a store till. Approximately \$14,500.00 worth of property owned by C.P.R. was recovered during the month, and charges of possession of stolen property have been laid against a man and his wife. Two men have been charged after four complete motorcycles and parts of ten others were recovered as a result of investigation by Special "E" Squad and other members. This has broken up an active ring, and investigators are continuing to obtain evidence for more charges.
