REMARKS:

In accordance with your wishes, complete statistical information is not being forwarded with this report but is available if requested. These statistics will be analyzed and commented on in the 'remarks' portion of this report.

Since December, 1970, there have been several cases of hitchhikers being picked up in Vancouver and raped in secluded areas of Vancouver and Burnaby. An intensive investigation by both police departments has resulted in the arrest of a 26-year-old Vancouver man who is presently charged with two offences of rape in Vancouver and two in Burnaby.

The incidence of break-ins of homes and apartments has increased considerably during the past month, attributed in part to residences being left unattended and insecure by occupants during the hot weather or whilst away on vacation. Patrols have been increased, and a concerted effort is being made to curtail these offences.
