REMARKS:

On 16 AUG 71 a man entered a North Burnaby home about 2:30 A.M. and after tying up two persons and committing robbery he kidnapped the 19-year-old housewife. She was driven to the Squamish area where she was raped, and subsequently driven back to Burnaby and released. A 21-year-old escapee from Hancy Correctional Institute was arrested on 17 AUG 71 and has been charged with Kidnapping, Robbery and Rape.

Break-ins of houses and apartments, and thefts from motor vehicles, continued to require a great deal of police attention during August and our patrols, which were increased in July, continue to concentrate on these problems. To date there has been no noticeable decline in this type of offence.
