27. Re: Agreement with Canada, Province, New Westminster and Summer Games Society.

Attached is a copy of a letter dated September 23, 1971, from G. W. Ramsell, President, 1973 Canada Summer Games Society, addressed to Mr. R. W. Brough, asking that Council rescind the portion of the resolution passed last Monday evening which stated that the Mayor was authorized to execute the Agreement provided that "(c) The Society first signs the sub-agreement between Burnaby and the Society which is dated May 3, 1971."

The Municipal Solicitor does not feel that the contents of Mr. Ramsell's letter detracts from the opinion that he has already given recommending that the sub-agreement be executed. The Manager is of the same opinion.

Dear Sirs:

Further to your letter of September 17, 1971 requesting that the Society execute an Agreement pertaining to the expenses incurred and to be incurred in the dredging of the Burnaby Lake, this matter was placed before the Executive Committee of the Society held September 22, 1971.

This Committee passed a resolution to the effect that the Society not enter into this Agreement, and accordingly, we are enclosing the four (4) copies of the Agreement to you unexecuted. There are two main reasons why the Executive Committee felt the Society could not properly enter into this Agreement. The first of those is that the proposed contract between Canada, British Columbia, Burnaby, New Westminster and the Society contains the provision whereby any excess in capital expenditures over and above that set out in the budget annexed to this Agreement are to be borne equally by the Municipality of Burnaby and the City of New Westminster. The additional foreseeable expenses incurred and to be incurred in connection with the dredging of Burnaby Lake have, of course, not been approved by the Co-ordinating Committee designated in the master Agreement for the staging of the Games, but since this dredging has now been done for all practical purposes, the Committee will have no alternative but to approve the expenditures that had been incurred prior to its existence.

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7A-601 ROYAL AVENUE NEW WESTMINSTER BRITISH COLUMBIA TELEPHONE -524-0101 The net effect of this is that even if the Society entered into the Agreement with respect to the dredging of the Lake, the costs of such dredging over and above the budgetary figure would eventually fall upon Burnaby and New Westminster.

The second and more compelling reason why the Executive felt it could not properly authorize the execution of the Agreement between the Society, was that the Society itself is really between the Society, was that the Society itself is really a child of Burnaby and New Westminster and has no funds, and a child of Burnaby and New Westminster and has no funds, and any obligations it would incur by executing the Agreement, and accordingly, the Executive Committee would be acting in bad accordingly, the Executive Committee would be acting in bad faith if it recommended the Society enter into an Agreement knowing full well that it could not perform the obligations imposed upon it persuant to the Agreement.
