Following for your information is the report of the Medical Health Officer covering the activities of his Department for the month of October, 1971.

MONTHLY REPORT

Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report of this Department for the month of October 1971.

During the month the dental clinics in the south, situated in the Edmonds and Windsor schools, surveyed all the grade I children in the board and non-board schools. Next month the dental clinic situated in the Capitol Hill School will survey all the Grade I school children in North Burnaby. Later on, all the children in the kindergarten grades will also be surveyed in the Burnaby Schools. The programme carried out by the dental clinics for these children in their early years is a preventative programme and the Health Department still endorses the fluoridation of the Municipal water supply as the ideal method of prevention.

Three students from the University of British Columbia, School of Nursing, are with the Department this year for their field experience. These students are with the Department every Tuesday, attending schools, child health centres, district visiting and other aspects of public health under the supervision of the Health Department staff.

There has been an increase in the rat infestation in Burmaby. This could be due in part to a peak period, however, careless garbage disposal by residents in the Municipality is also a contributing factor. One of the public health inspectors is assigned to this aspect of the work in efforts to control the problem.

A large number of water samples are taken on a regular monthly basis and at special times upon request. A boat and motor has recently been purchased to enable the inspectors to sample Deer Lake and Burnaby Lake at various points and depths. The dredging on Burnaby Lake has recently been completed and water samples are being taken to ensure the pollution level is within safe limits.

The communicable disease picture shows a slight increase which is to be expected at this time of the year. There were 62 cases of communicable diseases reported with 29 mumps, 7 each salmonellosis and infectious hepatitis, 4 each pediculosis and impetigo, 2 each scabies, conjunctivitis, measles and 1 each whooping cough, chickenpox, rubella, ringworm and tuberculosis.
