Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report for this Department for the month of March 1971.

A study of the Public Health Nurses Workload was compiled during the month of March. The figures have now been tallied and show that in the 51 board schools and 12 non-board in the municipality there is an enrolment of 29,070 board school pupils and 2,025 non-board pupils. There are 15 Child Health Centres serving a total enrolment of 3,368 infant and preschool children who attend on an appointment basis. Six classes were held in the 2 prenatal centres located in north and south Burnaby. Two of the classes were held in the afternoon and four in the evening. The classes involve two hour sessions of exercises and instruction. There were sixteen immunization clinics held during the month. These clinics are held primarily for adults who are travelling and the need for these is so great that there is a possibility that extra clinics will have to be added. In addition, in the Tuberculosis control program, a tuberculin testing clinic is held once monthly and streptomycin clinics are held twice weekly. There were 164 babies born during the four week workload period. There was a total of 1,352 families under supervision during this month, these would include school, preschool, tuberculosis, rheumatic fever, and geriatrics.

Time analysis of the public health nursing service was conducted during the month. The study showed that 49.5% of the time was spent in school program, and 11.8% of the time spent in child health centres, 2.7% of time in the prenatal classes and 20.4% of the time home visiting. The balance of the time was spent in the many varied activities pertaining to the public health program.

There was an increase in the communicable diseases reported during the month with 268 cases reported. Of this number there were 175 rubella, 40 chickenpox, 22 mumps, 17 pediculosis, 5 measles, 3 impetigo and whooping cough and 1 each scarlet fever, salmonellosis, and infectious hepatitis. Absenteeism in the schools has been extremely high during the month due to the recent influenza outbreak, however the rate of absenteeism has now returned to its normal pattern.
