Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report for this Department for the month of February 1971.

In a statistical review of the cancer deaths in Burnaby during 1970, the report shows that there were a total of 182 cancer deaths during the year. The breakdown as to site, is as follows-35 lung, 23 breast, 17 each stomach and bowel, 10 rectum, 9 each leukaemia and bladder, 6 each prostate and ovaries, 4 uterus, 1 cervix and 31 in other sites. A further breakdown by age-group showed that there was 1 in the 5 - 14 year age group, none in the 15 - 24 year age group, 11 in the 25 - 44 year age group, 71 in the 45 - 64 year age group, 80 in the 65 - 84 and 19 in the 85 and over age group.

The demand is ever increasing for the administration of various immunizations and vaccinations for people who are travelling. An additional clinic on Monday mornings has been commenced to bring to three the immunization clinics conducted by the Health Department to which these people are referred on appointment basis. To fulfill the recommended requirements of the World Health Organization, a wide variety of immunizations are offered. These include smallpox, diphtheria, tetanus, poliomyelitis, typhoid, para-typhoid, cholera and typhus. The International Certificate of Vaccination for Immunizations is completed by the Department to fulfill a requirement for persons travelling to foreign lands.

The eye clinic which is operated by this department is now in great demand due perhaps in part, to the present unemployment situation. An eye specialist from Vancouver comes to the Unit at regular intervals to conduct this clinic. The clinic is designed for children whose parents have no medical coverage and are in a low income bracket.

The communicable diseases report this month shows an increase over the previous month with 193 cases reported. Of these there were 56 chickenpox, 51 rubella, 49 mumps, 15 whooping cough, 6 pediculosis, 4 each measles and infectious hepatitis, 3 salmonellosis, and 2 each scarlet fever and tuberculosis, and 1 impetigo. The rubella cases reported are in the age group of 12 years and over.
