The Minutes of the April 24, 1972 Council Meeting came forward for adoption.

Mayor Prittie indicated that he had voted against the Motion to abandon Burnaby Zoning By-law 1965, Amendment By-law No. 29, 1972, which was shown on Page 28 of the Minutes of the April 24th meeting. and he wished the minutes to reflect this.

Moved by Alderman Ladner, seconded by Alderman Dowding "That the minutes of the Council meeting held on April 24, 1972, be amended by showing Mayor Prittie against the Motion mentioned by fim, and the minutes, as so amended, be adopted."

The following matters were then lifted from the table:

(a) Tenders for 1972 Street Improvements.

Alderman Drummond and Alderman Clark expressed their views on the manner in which tenders had been invited for the street improvements in question.

Their contention was that it was not proper that bidders be allowed to quote on the basis of unit prices because the quantities of materials required by the Municipality were uncertain.

They suggested that Council should consider accepting the tenders of the lowest bidders in each of the categories of work.

Item 26 of the Municipal Manager's Report No. 30, 1972, which dealt with the subject at hand, was then brought forward.

The following is the substance of that report:

(26). Tenders for 1972 Street Improvements.

The Municipal Engineer has submitted a report, a copy of which was being presented this evening, outlining his position in regard to the matter of awarding contracts for the 1972 street improvements, including the points made in Council on April 24 in regard to the matter.

The Engineer had concluded that there is no question the timing and format of the tender call was proper so he was recommending that the proposal advanced to Council on April 24th be accepted.

He has also indicated that it is intended to intensify his knowledge of market conditions in the industry.

It has been concluded, after a very exhaustive study and meetings with persons involved in the subject at hand, that:

- (a) if the Corporation had separated the concrete works from the paving works, there would have been more tenders; however, it is not considered desirable to let contracts for the work in question in too small amounts.
- (b) the municipality should not re-tender at this time because the offers now in hand are considered as favourable as they could be.
- (c) the practice followed of inviting tenders at this time was desirable because of prevailing market conditions in the field of concrete and asphalt work.

(a) It was recommended that:Council accept the tender of Jack Cewe Limited in the amount of \$1,373,063.60 for the various street improvements listed in the report Council received on April 24, 1972, with final payment to be based on the actual quantities and the unit prices tendered for each item.

(b) The Municipal Engineer make provision in future tender calls to allow the option of dividing concrete works from asphalt works on some projects as one alternative.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN DAILLY, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN BLAIR: "That the recommendations of the Manager be adopted."

(7) Social Assistance Costs .

The Social Services Administrator has evaluated remarks made in the letter Council received on April 4th from the Minister of Rehabilitation and Social Improvement relating to social assistance costs, as follows:

- (a) there has been a reduction in caseloads in all categories of social assistance of 12% on a province-wide basis as of February 1972, as compared to the same period in 1971.
- (b) Burnaby's case load of unemployed employables as of March 1971 was 1,296, a reduction of 43% from March, 1972.
- (c) It appears from a cursory review of Bill 49 that the intent of the Minister is to place authority for the Social Assistance Act in the hands of the Cabinet instead of the Minister, or the Director of the Department of Rehabilitation and Social Improvement. It does not seem that provision has been made for an appeal Board to hear cases where clients feel they have been unfairly treated.
- (d) In summary, the current legislation will not have any undue effect on the Municipal Social Service Department.
- (8) Monthly Report of 1973 Canada Summer Games Society.

A report of the Executive Director of the above Society covering the activities of the Society between March 14 and April 18, 1972 was being submitted herewith.

He also does not recommend that an extra Special Constable be engaged by the Municipality for the same purpose as he feels the R.C.M.P. has better control over School Patrols with the present organizational arrangement.

The Officer-in-Charge also pointed out that the S/Sgt, in charge of the Traffic Detail has been designated by the Traffic Safety Committee to discuss School Patrol activities with Principals of the Schools in Burnaby at a meeting scheduled for May 8, 1972.

It was recommended that consideration of the matter at hand be held in abeyance pending receipt of a further report from the R.C.M.P. after the May 8th meeting mentioned above.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN BLAIR, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN LAWSON: "That the recommendation of the Manager be adopted." Carried Unanimously.

(14) West Side of Burnaby Mountain.

It was recommended that a report of the Planning Department that was being submitted herewith relating to the captioned subject be tabled until the May 8th meeting of Council.

- (b) The open ditches on the street are minimal because the area is serviced with a combined sewer. An inspection has shown that the ditches are in normal condition with no particular problem.
- (c) Frances Street has a 20-foot interim pavement.
- (d) An earlier request for the construction of the lane at the rear was denied by Council in March 1969 because of the substandard width of the lane and the fact that it could not be cancelled due to the existence of utility poles in the allowance.
