REMARKS:  
 On March 21, 1972 Lloyd George Forrester was sentenced to twenty years imprisonment when convicted of the armed robbery of Toronto Dominion Bank, Willingdon & Lougheed, on August 18, 1971. Forrester was one of Canada's ten most wanted criminals prior to his arrest.

On March 29, 1972 Jean Guy Gilles Hinse @ Hinze was convicted of extortion involving a local bank manager and sentenced to three years imprisonment.

During the month there were five robberies victimizing service stations and/or private individuals. None of the robberies involved large sums of money and all are under active investigation, however, no arrests have been made to date.

The incidence of motor vehicle thefts continued to rise despite added efforts being applied in this area of crime. It is pleasing to report, however, that our ratio of successful conclusions of Break and Enter investigations indicates a clearance rate of 51.9% at this time compared to 9% at this time last year.
