5. Re: Medical Health Monthly Report

Following for your information is the report of the Medical Health Officer covering the activities of his Department for the month of November, 1971.

Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report of this Department for the month of November 1971.

The dental survey was completed this month by the Capitol Hill Dental Clinic for all the grade one children in the North Burnaby board and non-board schools. The fee remains at \$5.00 which covers complete dental treatment and topical application of fluorine solution. It is expected that the kindergarten age group will be surveyed early in 1972.

Mrs. Eraine Jansson, a speech therapist with the Department, resigned during the month. She has now taken a position with the Burnaby Mental Health Centre. It is hoped that this position will be filled very shortly as there is a large case-load and a growing waiting list for this service.

The measles programme which was commenced in August of 1969 is being continued. This vaccine is being offered to all children from ages 1 - 6 which includes the grade one children. The vaccine is administered in the schools to children in grades 1 and kindergarten, while those children who are under school—age receive this vaccine at any one of the 15 Child Health Centres throughout Burnaby. The value of this programme is being observed in the diminishing number of measles cases reported.

A successful weekly television series "The Nine Month Trip" was presented by the public health nursing staff of the Greater Vancouver Health Services this fall. This was a prenatal instruction programme and was completed this month. One of the series was planned and produced by the Burnaby public health nurses.

There were 67 cases of communicable diseases reported during the month. Of these, there were 35 mumps, 9 chickennox, 5 infectious hepatitis, 4 rubella, 3 each measles and tuberculosis, 2 each scables and pediculosis, and 1 each scarlet fever, impetigo, ringworm and salmonellosis.
