REMARKS: During the month there was one armed robbery reported. A service station attendant at Eagle Ford Shell Service was threatened with a knife on May 13, 1972 at approximately 11:45 P.M. and robbed of approximately \$150.00 by a lone bandit. To date no arrest has been made but investigation is continuing. The strike by municipal workers has caused some problems, but we are managing to function in a fairly normal manner with all complaints being attended to as expeditiously as possible. There are some figures unavailable to complete this report due to the absence of Court staff, and these will be supplied at a later date if required.
