REMARKS:

On July 18, 1972 a 13-year-old girl was shot and killed in a Burnaby home when a .303 rifle was discharged while she and other children were watching T.V. A 16-year-old juvenile apparently was showing the rifle to his companions when it discharged. Investigation is still continuing into this matter and an Inquest has been ordered.

On July 29, 1972 a 25-year-old inmate of L.M.R.C.C. was stabbed in his left lower abdomen and is recovering in hospital. Another inmate is suspected of this offence and investigation is continuing.

A 59-year-old Burnaby man has been charged with attempting to murder his daughter-in-law as a result of a stabbing which occurred on July 30, 1972. The victim is in hospital and is expected to survive the ordeal.

A 25-year-old man was sentenced to two years in gaol when convicted of robbing a Burnaby housewife of a small sum of money at her apartment, under threat of bodily harm.
