MONTHLY REPORT

Dear Sir:

I have the pleasure of submitting a report for this Department for the month of September 1972.

The total enrolment in the board schools this September is 27,815 and in the non-board schools 1,927 making a grand total of 29,742 pupils. These figures include the opening of a new school this year, Montécito whose total enrolment is 100. The school health services are offered to children in both board and non-board schools. It was the policy of the school board three years ago to include kindergarten in a number of schools this policy has continued and there are now thirty-three schools offering a kindergarten program to 1601 children. The school health services arranges a full health assessment for all children in the kindergarten age group and also to grade I children who are entering school for the first time and have not previously been examined by the school medical health officers. The findings of these health examinations are shared with the teachers by a public health nurse, so that children can be assisted to their fullest extent in the school situation.

Three new nurses joined the staff this month replacing three who had resigned earlier in the summer. Mrs. Eileen Hubert, Bachelor of Science in Nursing, University of Ottawa; Miss Beverley O'Brien, Bachelor of Science in Nursing, University of British Columbia; and Mrs. Janice Olsen, Bachelor of Science in Nursing also from the University of British Columbia. These nurses were appointed September 1st.

Mr. B. Williams Senior Public Health Inspector gave a lecture on provincial government regulations governing the sanitation and operation of food premises to those students taking Hotel/Motel management course at B.C.I.T.

The resignation was received from Mr. A. Lincoln as Senior Public Health Inspector who left this department to return to Vancouver City Health Department.

The communicable diseases remain at a fairly low level with 27 cases reported during the month of these there were 7 infectious hepatitis, 5 impetigo, 4 each mumps and pediculosis, 3 salmonellosis, 2 tuberculosis and 1 each measles and ringworm.
