REMARKS:

During the month there were four armed robberies. One occurred at Brentwood Liquor Vendors when a lone bandit with a double barrelled shotgun robbed them of over \$400.00. This is presently under active investigation. The Hollywood Market at 6168 Kingsway was robbed of about \$230.00 by a lone male armed with a gun; and the Caribou Hill Grocery was robbed of approximately \$60.00 by two men, one armed with a hunting knife and the other with a revolver. To date the culprits have not been captured. The Eagle Shell Service was robbed by a man who struck the night attendant with a metal pipe and threatened him with a knife forcing him to hand over approximately \$400.00. The culprit was apprehended a short distance from the scene and has been sentenced to two years less a day definite and two years indeterminate. He was an escapee from a prison camp near Kamloops and stated he committed the robbery to support a \$40.00 per day drug habit.

A 33-year-old man has been charged with the rape of a 25-year-old woman who hitchhiked a ride with him on the 10th October 1972.

All available members and Auxiliaries were on duty Hallowe'en and I am pleased to report no major incidents occurred.
