REMARKS: At 9:14 A.M. on April 10, 1972 four armed and masked men broke into the Bank of Montreal at Brentwood Shopping Centre and got away with loot amounting to \$114,900.00. One of the culprits was armed with a submachine gun, and the other three had revolvers. They broke the glass out of the front door of the bank, entered the premises and threatened the bank employees who were preparing to open for business. One shot was fired in an attempt to open a locked drawer, however, nobody was injured. The culprits appeared to be part of a well organized, ruthless gang, and our investigators are vigorously investigating this offence at the present time.

During the month, a gambling raid was conducted at the Chinese Community Centre on East Hastings. This resulted in the arrest of 41 persons. Fourteen have been charged for keeping a gaming house, and 27 were treated as "found ins". This matter is presently before the Courts.

Due to the local municipal employees' strike, it is not possible to obtain some of the figures usually provided in this report. A supplementary report will be provided when the information can be obtained.
