REMARKS: During the month there were very few serious crimes reported. One complaint of rape was received and a charge has been laid in this case. Our Fraud Section was involved in investigating and were instrumental in arresting a 26-year-old man who opened 13 bank accounts amounting to approximately \$20,000.00 at various banks in the Greater Vancouver area by depositing worthless cheques. He was arrested before he realized any profit from his endeavours and has been charged with several counts of attempted fraud as well as a Narcotics Act charge.

The renovations planned for our offices are now nearly completed. The file room has been relocated and the other offices have been occupied. Planning of the new Control Centre console and complex is progressing favourably and a contract should be let sometime in October.

A Canadian Police Information Centre terminal has been installed at this office. This is a direct link with a computer in Ottawa. Operation will commence on the 1st November, 1972, and until then the terminal is in an instructional mode for use to train personnel. We have been actively training personnel to operate our terminal and it is expected that this new service will be most helpful operationally.
