REMARKS: During the month a seizure of approximately 60,000 magazines and books was made from a distributor in Burnaby and charges of distributing pornography have been laid against three individuals and the distributing firm of Johnson & Franklin. A reported armed robbery of a service station proved false, and an attendant has been charged with public mischief and Theft Over \$50.00. A husband and wife are presently facing charges of gross indecency involving a 14-year-old boy resulting from incidents which occurred in Burnaby on 25 June 72. The seizure of a quantity of firearms has resulted in charges against one Raymond Trudel; the weapons included semi-automatic firearms and small arms. Police functions at this detachment have returned to normal following the recent municipal strike, however, the courts are still handling a backlog of work and some figures normally supplied with this report are not available at this time. Reference my March, 1972 report on increasing incidence of car thefts, I am pleased to report this has been reduced over the last two months.
