REMARKS:

In the early A.M. of November 10, 1972 two masked men armed with revolvers broke into the home of a chain store Asst. Manager in Burnaby. They accosted the Asst. Manager and his wife who had been asleep, and demanded the keys for the store and the combination of the store safe. The victims were handcuffed and a length of chain was used to secure them together on the bed. The victims could not supply the demands and the culprits left after stealing \$5.00 to \$10.00 from the house. An infant sleeping in an adjoining bedroom was not disturbed. Police were alerted by an anonymous phone call presumably made by the culprits. No arrests have been made to date but active investigation is continuing.

In the early A.M. of November 20, 1972, the night clerk of the Lougheed Hotel was robbed and left blindfolded and secured with adhesive tapes, by three men, one armed with a handgun. The culprits escaped with approximately \$500.00. To date no suspects have been established but investigation is continuing.

On November 25, 1972 a masked man robbed a Children's Wear store of approximately \$1,000.00. The Manageress attempted to fight the robber and was struck several times with the gun. A suspect is being actively investigated.
