REMARKS: On August 18, 1972 the night attendant at Kern's Motor Town Service Station on Canada Way in Burnaby reported that he was accosted by three persons who threatened him with tire irons, then tied him up in the stockroom and robbed the premises of approximately \$500.00. Three suspects are presently being investigated regarding this offence.

On August 30, 1972 the Bank of Nova Scotia on Sunset Street was robbed of approximately \$3,735.00 by a lone bandit who exhibited a handgun and demanded money. Investigation is being very actively followed up, but no arrest has been made to date.

A conviction was registered in Burnaby Court against a woman who defrauded the Welfare Services of \$3,202.50. She received a suspended sentence and was ordered to make restitution in the amount of \$3,202.50 before April 1, 1973.

In preparation for return to school of Burnaby pupils, our Traffic Section gave several lectures to general duty members during August on traffic safety and school patrols, and it is hoped this will increase our coverage and provide enforcement and guidance throughout the municipality.
